Judged Entry Instructions

Quilts must be delivered to the Yuba Sutter Fair Grounds between the hours of
8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Thursday March 18, 2010

All judged entries must be accompanied by:

- Quilt Show Entry Form
- Judged Entry Form
- Picture
- \$5.00 per judged quilt entry, checks are to be made payable to VQG.

General Information:

- Maximum number of entries per person is 2 in any one judged class.
- To determine quilt size, add total inches on all four sides.
- Valley Quilt Guild “Rules of Entry” apply to Judged entries.
- In case of any dispute related to the judging process, the judge’s decision will be final.

- Ribbons will be awarded to 1, 2, 3, and up to 2 honorable mentions in all categories. One Best of Show Ribbon will be awarded to 1 quilt from Class 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Class 6, 7, and 8 are not eligible for Best of Show. A Judge’s Choice Ribbon (Personal selection of the Judge) will be awarded from the judged entries. All entries, judged or not, will be eligible for the Viewers Choice Award.
- Quilter’s Name must be provided.

Division Definitions:

- LARGE – over 300 inches
- MEDIUM – 150 to 299 inches
- SMALL – up to 149 inches
- WEARABLE ART

Class Definitions:

- Traditional – Comprised of recognizable, traditional blocks.
- Innovative/Art – Original creativity by the maker, can be adapted from a traditional design but must be significantly altered by innovative use of design, fabrics, color, embellishments, three dimensional piecing or other original techniques.
- Appliqué -All Hand or Machine Appliqué must be done by the maker.
- Mixed Technique – Quilts that are both significantly appliquéd and pieced should be entered under this category.
- Other or Special Techniques -Whole cloth, photo transfer, embroidery, etc
- Group Quilt – Components (blocks, borders, embellishments, etc.) made by more than one person.
- Kit Quilt – A quilt which is made from a kit including fabric and pattern, strip club quilts, printed panels, and pre-printed whole cloth.
- Wearable Art -These should be fashionable and wearable garments with an emphasis on quilting.
