August 4, 2010

President: Meeting called to order at 7:00pm by Gladys Harris.

Secretary: Minutes of the July 2010 meeting were approved as corrected. There was no correspondence.

Treasurer:

Report: Checking: 2,480.47 Savings: 22,184.36

A discussion was held on the program Quicken for the computer. DeRay Jensen moved, seconded by Valerie Wilson to buy the updated Quicken program. The motion was approved.

DeRay presented the proposed budget. After discussion it was decided to boost property up to \$300, Christmas raffle expense up to \$1000, Christmas Party basket raffle income to \$500, Increase Website to \$900, program supplies to \$650, Program travel to \$900, and community service: quilting \$200, Wounded Warriors \$200, and supplies \$1000. Cooky Amarel moved, it was seconded the budget be accepted as changed. The motion was approved.

Membership: Pat Jensen reported new members receive the Guild brochure in the membership packet. 153 members have registered. The roster is at the printers.

After discussion about emails, mailing costs, and printing costs Cooky Amarel moved and it was seconded that a policy be set this year that members will receive their newsletter either by email or pay \$11 for printing and postage to have it mailed. It was approved with one con vote. This policy will begin Sept. 1, 2010.

New Business:

1. **Quilt Show:** Cathy Evans reported that the Opportunity Quilt is completed, post cards are being printed, the pin example was shown and will be available in September 2010, and name tag examples were shown.
2. **Fair Quilt:** Carleen Hagen announced we made \$498 on the raffle of the quilt made from last year's fair quilt blocks.
3. **Christmas Party:** Carleen reported the dining area of the Presbyterian Church has been reserved for the party. Becky Pendergraph and Theresa Mihalyi reported that tickets for the Christmas party should be ready for sale in September 2010. A USO theme will be used for the party with entertainment, Santa, basket raffle and much more.
4. **Community Service:** Quilts will be given to Foster care in January 2011.
5. **Publicity:** Cathy Evans asked community service for information for an article. She would like information on speakers to put in an article also.
6. Gladys thanked Cathy Evans for reserving the meeting room through July 2011.
7. **Library:** Cari Jimison reported she spoke with Janet Siller, who said they are going to a coded security system on the third floor and asked if we wanted one on the library door at no cost to the Guild. She would like to meet with the executive board to discuss the security system and our contract with them.

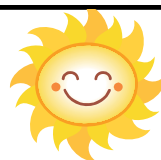

Linda Ballard will be here on August 13 and 14 with a workshop "King Solomon's Temple," which is a two-color quilt. We have 33 quilters signed up to date so it should be a great class. The class will meet at the Fremont Conference Center on Friday, August 13 from 6 - 9 p.m. and Saturday, August 14 from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.

On August 25 is the Ice Cream Social and Community Service (CS) Sew Night in St. Andrew Ministry Center, the large room with the kitchen. Bring your appetite for a cool treat and your sewing supplies for working on CS quilts. We need a few irons and ironing boards. Bring your own project for CS or the CS girls will have kits to check out. If you prefer to help a friend work on theirs, there is always pressing and other tasks to do.

For the September 29 meeting, our own Diane Steele will present a lecture and trunk show on "Antique Quilts: Where to Buy Them, How Much to Pay." She will have antique quilts to show and be sharing information about quilting history.

FYI - NATIONAL PARKS & FEDERAL RECREATIONAL LANDS PASS

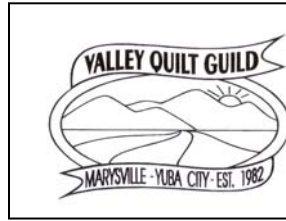
This pass covers entrance fees or standard amenity fees at sites managed by the National Park Service, United States Department of Agriculture—Forest Service, United States Fish & Wildlife Service, Bureau of Reclamation, and the Bureau of Land Management. The pass provides you with access to and use of America's beautiful lakes, rivers and seashores, wildlife refuges, outstanding cultural and historic sites, and some of the world's most magnificent forests, parks, and monuments.

The Annual Pass costs \$80.00 and is valid for one full year from the month of purchase.

The Senior Pass is a lifetime pass available to individuals 62 years or older and costs \$10.00. You must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. This pass must be purchased in person as your birth date and signature must be verified by your driver's license or other identification.

The Access Pass is a free lifetime pass available to an individual who is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident and is medically determined to have a permanent disability that severely limits one or more major life activities. This pass must be obtained in person as proof of the type of Federal disability is collected, i.e., copy of letter from Social Security regarding benefits, or a physician's statement as to disability.

Passes are non-refundable, non-transferable, and cannot be replaced if lost or stolen.
