### Helpful Hints from Alyce

If you don't have thread to match the fabric, use one a shade or two darker. It will blend in much better than a lighter color.

If you don't have any iron cleaner, try using a piece of waxed paper and rub your hot iron over this several times. It will help clean off a light residue and leave a smoother surface on the sole plate.

For embroidery, place it face down on a towel to press. The stitches will not flatten and will be more noticeable.


