The Yuba-Sutter Fair is happening live and in person June 24 – 27. Valley Quilt Guild will again be helping in the Still Exhibits in Franklin Hall, where the quilts are displayed. This is a way we can contribute to our community, as well as getting a \$1,000 reduction of the fees we pay for the main exhibit hall when we have our quilt show. For any members who feel comfortable doing so, we need volunteers for set-up and take-down of the quilts, and also to be at the quilt table in Franklin Hall during the fair. Being at the table involves selling raffle tickets, accepting quilt blocks, answering questions about the guild and giving a membership application if appropriate, and reminding people about not eating and no touching the quilts as they look at the exhibits. We do this in shifts – 3 shifts per day, 3 people per shift. The last time we did this we needed 36 volunteer slots to be filled. Please get together with a couple friends and volunteer for a shift!

The fair also needs quilt entries. The entry deadline is May 25. You can enter online at ysfair.com or you can send in a paper entry form. The fee for each quilt is \$2.00. Quilts need to be delivered to Franklin Hall at the fair June 11, 2 pm to 8 pm and June 12, 9 am to 6 pm. Judging is closed to the public and takes place on June 13 at 9 am.

The guild needs entries in the block contest. We use these to make the quilts that are raffled off the next year. There is no fee to enter, and no entry limit. Entries are to be delivered to the Quilt Table in Franklin Hall by 3:30 pm on Saturday, June 26, 2021.

A meeting of the **Valley Quilt Guild Board** was held on April 15, 2021. It was an online meeting using the ZOOM application since the pandemic quarantine is still in effect. It was called to order at 4:06 pm.

**Secretary:** A motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting was made by Cooky Amarel and seconded by Carleen Hagen. A unanimous vote followed.

Treasurer: We have a checking balance of \$1,530.83 and a savings balance of \$16,663.71.

**Old Business:** The virtual quilt show is online and ready to be voted upon.

**Nominating Committee:** Carleen Hagen has possible volunteers to run for the position of 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President and is still working on finding someone for Treasurer. Cooky Amarel is willing to help train a new Treasurer.

**New Business:** Colleen Pelfrey and Michelle Jones, respectively, are willing to continue in the position of President and 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President if that is the pleasure of the membership. This exception to the term limit rule can only be accomplished through a motion and a member vote.

At the general meeting on March 31, 2021, Diane Steele moved and Jan Henrich seconded to make a 1 year exception to the two-year term limit rule, whereby Colleen Pelfrey and Michelle Jones would be able to serve for an additional year.

Membership voted by Zoom poll, and the results were unanimous: 100% in favor of the exception.

**Fair:** Cooky reported that the 2021 Yuba-Sutter Fair is going ahead with a normal fair June 24-27. There is not expected to be a big turnout for the craft rooms. Volunteers will be needed to help with the Franklin Hall exhibit room including setup and workers for each day of the fair. This allows our guild to receive our discount on the main exhibit hall during our show. Entry forms for submitting any quilt entries will be available on our website.

Ice Cream gathering in July? Diane Leighton stated that St. Andres is just starting to open, and Carleen will check with CalTrans. Having a gathering in a park was also an option.

Vice President Update: April's presenter will be Christina Cameli and May will be Trudy Cleveland.

**Community Service:** Incoming tops have slowed down. There are a couple of bindings which need to be done. Diane offered her house as an outdoor meeting place to film all the quilts for an upcoming Quilt meeting.

**Opportunity Quilt/Quilt Show:** We have a booth at the Reno show, June 10-12. We will not be charged for the space if we provide people to help set up and take down the show. The show will be set up on the 10<sup>th</sup>, taken down is the evening of the 13<sup>th</sup>. This should be a fun road trip!

**Membership:** Nicky Lura has approached Sew Katie Jean to become affiliate members. Membership will be due in May and will be mentioned in the May newsletter. There will be no change in fees.

**Zoom Sew Day:** 13 members participated. The Carnival Glass pattern by Villa Rosa was donated for those wishing to try something new.

**Adjournment:** The meeting was adjourned at 5:07 pm.
