# **Community Service:**

Diane Leighton submitted the following history from 2016 so our members would know about our contributions. Thank you to all for your generous contributions!

# **Community Service History (2016-present)**

**July 2016** - When Diane Steele and Diane Leighton became co-presidents, Dee Jagerhorn relinquished her duties as chairman of Community Service. Where to house the huge supply of fabric and other supplies became a dilemma. Diane Leighton agreed to be "keeper of the goods." The stash fills one-half of her garage and the CS helpers meet at her house to make kits, cut backs and battings, prepare everything to hand out at the meetings. Wanda Horn and Carolyn McCray have served as chairmen of Community Service.

**December 2016-** 89 quilts were donated to Foster Care. Leah Eneix accepted the quilts. Leah is with the Foster Kinship Care Education program at Yuba College.

**January 2017** - CS had accepted fabric from a former member's stash and the unusable fabric was donated to Eileen Brubaker for use in her Home Economics class at Yuba City High School.

**March 2017** - 5 quilts were given to the Camp Singer boys who helped us set up and take down at the quilt show.

March 2017 - Sew Day for Community Service. We gave 8 tiny quilts to Sutter Neonatal Unit in Sacramento.

**July 2017-** 47 Quilts were given to Foster Care. Leah Eneix accepted the quilts.

October 2017 - 10 baby quilts were donated to Beale squadron through Nicki Lura.

CS accepted the huge stash (25 plastic bins full) of former member Connie Sanford. Unusable fabric was given to Eileen Brubaker and packages of 3 pounds of coordinated fabric were sold for \$10 each. The money was used for CS.

**December 2017** - At VQG Christmas party, we sold 28 \$10 packages of Connie's bagged fabric.

We gave 75 quilts to Foster Care. Leah Eneix accepted the quilts.

March 2018 - 4 quilts (3 boys, 1 girl) were given to the Camp Singer kids for helping with the heavy work at the Quilt Show.

March 2018 - 32 walker and wheelchair bags were presented to the Fountains.

April 2018 - 21 "fidget quilts" were given to Rideout for use in their dementia unit.

June 2018 - 12 guilts were delivered to Juvenile Hall for rewards for the kids.

July 2018 - Diana Adams accepted 100 quilts for Foster Care after Leah Eneix retired.

**August 2018** - The first donation of 10 quilts (washed and in plastic bags) were delivered to the Rideout Cancer Center.

**Opportunity Quilt:** Billie reported that things are going well. She can always use more members to take the quilts to locations to increase ticket sales.

**Membership:** There were 7 new members signed up at the July meeting and 3 new members at the Fair! We still have a lot of members that have not paid their dues. Please make sure you bring your check to the August meeting if you plan to join. Joetta will have to finalize the membership roster at that point.

**UFO:** Things are going well. The only change is that in order to be considered a *completed* UFO it has to be more than a top.

# Helpful Hints from Alyce

Instead of using a cup or glass to fill your steam iron, use a clean soap bottle container with a snap-on lid. It eliminates spilled water and/or dust particles in the iron. It's also great to take along when attending a class or workshop. Note: If you buy creamer for your coffee, that bottle works well, too.

To add life to a the blade of the rotary cutter, occasionally take it apart, remove any lint and add a drop of sewing machine oil. This also makes for easier cutting.

To extend the life of the blade, turn it around as you will be cutting at a different angle.

For new members (and old-timers!), purchase Wrinkle Releaser at the Dollar Tree. It will help remove creased areas from fabric. Great stuff!

There were approximately 50 attendees from all over the North State. We were entertained by a mini-version of Lisa


