# Quilt Show Entry Information

### PICK UP YOUR RECEIPT/ENTRY CARDS WITH YOUR ENTRY NUMBERS & LABELS at the

February 24<sup>th</sup> general meeting. Please stop by our table to pick up your card, if you have a friend that can't attend the meeting, please pick up their card and deliver it to them. The show has been laid out and we have 220 entries plus 19 additional Challenge Quilts.

- **Be sure you SAVE your RECEIPT/ENTRY CARD.** This card is your receipt and will be needed to pickup up your quilt after the show.
- You will need to place the number for each quilt on the label and sew it in the lower right corner. (with the back of the quilt facing you sew it in the lower left corner).

Each quilt must have the entry number on the label and any quilt over 36" must have a sleeve.

Please Fold your quilt with the label showing on top! This saves us lots of time when taking in entries, refolding quilts, and looking for your label.

- JUDGED QUILTS DELIVERY: JUDGED QUILTS ARE TO BE DELIVERED ON THURSDAY 3/10/22 BETWEEN 8:30 AND 9:30 A.M. (I've heard some members say 8:00, this is incorrect it's 8:30.
- **REGULAR ENTRY DELIVERY:** Regular quilt entries are to be delivered Friday the 11<sup>th</sup> from

### 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.)

**Pickup –** Quilt/articles must be picked up on Sunday March 13, 2022, from 5-5:30 p.m. Your Receipt/Entry Card will be needed to pick up your quilt.

# **Board Meeting Minutes**

### VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING

February 7, 2022

### Location: Crossroads Community Church

### Date: February 7, 2022

**Call to Order:** A Meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on February 7, 2022 at the Crossroads Community Church. It was called to order at 4:06 pm.

**Secretary:** A motion to approve the minutes of the November meeting as written was made by Cooky Amarel and seconded by Michelle Jones. A unanimous vote to approve followed. Correspondence: There was a card from the Mary Overton family acknowledging condolences from the Guild.

**Treasurer:** We have a checking balance of \$4,126.03 and a savings balance of \$11,943.55. The Quilt Show balance is \$7,436.01 making our combined total \$23,505.59.

### Old Business:

**Meeting Venues –** Our February and March meetings will be at Gray Avenue Church. Colleen will check with Gray Avenue Church to try and schedule April and May there also. The Marjan Kluepful workshop on February 26 will be at the Rideout Conference Center.

Internal Audit Update - The Internal Audit is complete.

### New Business:

**Bylaws, Policies & Job Duties –** There were no changes in the Bylaws so no vote was needed at the general meeting. A motion was made by Linda Matsumoto and seconded by Carleen Hagen to approve the Job Duties and Policies as revised by the committee. A unanimous vote to approve followed.

**1099 Requirements for people quilting for Community Service** – It has been brought to our attention that anyone earning more than \$599 needs to be issued a 1099 for their earnings. It was decided that Community Service will watch for quilters that approach this threshold and will have them fill out a W-9 (gives the guild treasurer the information she needs) when necessary.

### Minutes continued...

**Bookkeeper** – The possibility of a bookkeeper was discussed and it was deemed not necessary at this time.

**New Member Welcome** – The possibility of having an existing guild member paired with a new member to help them navigate meetings, classes and answer questions was discussed. It was decided to ask for member volunteers first and then ask new members if they would like this assistance when they join.

**Community Service Quilt Donation Requests** – Community Service has received letters from Children's Hope (Foster Family Agency) and from Yuba Sutter Dialysis requesting quilt donations. After a discussion by the board a motion was made by Deanna Williams and seconded by Carleen Hagen to fill these requests as we are able to (availability of donation quilts). A unanimous vote to approve followed. It was reiterated that for a group to receive quilt donations from the guild, the guild must have a letter of request from the group and the approval of the board.

### Vice Presidents Update:

Sandra Mollon is scheduled to present her trunk show for the February 23, 2022 meeting. Marjan Kluepfel will have a workshop (Fabric Sculptures) on February 26, 2022. March will feature two members and an affiliate speaker.

Community Service: Received another fabric donation of good fabric

Opportunity Quilt: Went to Quilt Guilds of the North Quarter

Membership: We have 162 members including 2 junior members and 9 affiliates

**Quilt Show 2022**: The Quilt Show meeting on February 3 went well. There was a discussion on the need to increase the budget for the Friday lunch. They are doing individual sack lunches taking Covid safety into account. A motion was made by Eileen Milligan and seconded by Linda Matsumoto to double the \$250 budget making it \$500. A unanimous vote to approve followed. It was decided that the Challenge Quilts from 2020 and 2021 would be included in the quilt show as available. Colleen Pelfrey is working on contacting people who made quilts for those years.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 5:25 pm.

The next Board Meeting will be March 14, 2022 at 4 pm at Community Crossroads Church.
