

Quilt Show Judging Day

Quilt Show Judging day is Thursday, March 17, 2016. To all of you that are having your quilts judged I say a big THANK YOU. We are having 73 quilts judged this year. The total of the entry fees will pay the judges fee with some left over. First time ever!!!!!

Thursday March 17, 2016 is judging day. Please bring your quilts to be judged to the fairgrounds for check in between the hours of 8:30 am and 9:30 am. Any quilts not being judged should be delivered to the fairgrounds on Friday morning. Remember to have your label sewn on to the back (back of quilt facing you – label in bottom left corner) and the quilt folded with the label showing.

Judging will begin at 10:00 am. All guild members are invited to observe the judging. We will have a seating area for you. You do not have to stay all day, however, you are welcome to.

Beth Foust is our judge this year. Beth graduated from the West Coast Quilt Judging Academy in 2012. She is currently serving as the Assistant Director of NCQC and is a member of the Foothill Quilters Guild.

Quilt Show Entries

Quilt Show Entries – Members...We have 228 entries and Quilt Show Layout has been done. Your Entry numbers and fabric labels are ready to be picked up at the February 24th, General Meeting. Please stop by the table and pick up your Entry Numbers/Receipt 4" x 6" cards. Please keep this card in a safe place, it is needed to claim your entry/quilt at the end of the show. If you do not wish to use fabric labels, additional paper labels will be available at our table.

Things to Remember:

- Each entry requires a paper or fabric label sewn as follows:
- With the back of the quilt facing you, sew or baste the label in the lower left hand corner. (With the quilt facing you, it ends up being on the back of the quilt, in the lower right hand corner).
- Quilt entries over 36" require a 4" hanging sleeve sewn to the back top edge of the quilt.
- Exception Entry #'s 98 thru 139 will not require sleeves as they will be hung on the Baby Frames pinned to sheets. Please refer to Rules of Entry for instructions for instructions on how to make a hanging sleeve.
- When turning in your entry, please be sure it is folded with label side up and showing. (This speeds up check in time.)

Picking up quilts after the show. We try to start handing out quilts promptly at 5 p.m. The floor must be cleared and all quilts/entries must be accounted for and placed in order. All hands are needed, so please see the take down committee for instructions after the show to help. We do give out number for members who are waiting for their quilts, so your place is not lost in line.

Important Dates to Remember:

Judged Entries ONLY!!!! Must be delivered to the Yuba Sutter Fairground on Thursday, March 17th, 2016 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.

- **Delivery** Your quilt/article must be delivered to the Yuba Sutter Fairground on Friday, March 18th, 2016 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and are to arrive no later than 10:00 a.m.
- Pickup Quilts must be picked up on Sunday, March 20th after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. Bring your Card/Receipt to claim your quilt/entry.



Board Meeting Minutes

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING February 10, 2016

MEMBERS PRESENT: Cooky Amarel, Cheryl Gaines, Claire Poole, Wendy Cockrell, Linda Matsumoto, Margaret Rehermann, DeRay Jensen, Dee Jagerhorn, Carleen Hagen, Diane Leighton, Nancy Wilson, Kim Buzolich, Pat May, Valerie Wilson, Joann Thomas, Jody Ohrt, Ginger Benham, Shirley Jensen, and Sharon Easter.

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 12:04 noon by President Cooky Amarel.

SECRETARY: A motion was made and seconded (Jagerhorn/Rehermann) and unanimously voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of January 13, 2016 Board Meeting. A motion was made and seconded (Jagerhorn/Leighton) and unanimously voted to approve the minutes as written. A note was read from the Tri -Counties Blue Star Moms, thanking the Guild for the donated items that were sent in the Christmas care packages to our local military serving overseas. A thank you letter was read from the volunteer coordinator at Yountville Veterans Home, thanking us for 7 boxes of donated toiletries, cards, and gift cards that we mailed to them in December. A second letter was received from the Acting Chief of Therapeutic Activities at Yountville, again thanking us for our donations and included certificates of appreciation for 2014 and 2015.

TREASURER: The checking account has a balance of \$8,486.61 and the savings account has a balance of \$16,064.97. The sales tax for 2015 has been paid.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: The By-Laws Committee has met and had no changes to the current By-Laws. The Committee also reviewed the Policies & Procedures and the various Job Descriptions and had some minor changes to both documents.

Two surveys were turned in at the January meeting with names to be considered for a new slate of officers. The survey form will be printed again in the February newsletter and a box for completed forms will be at the February General Meeting. Please take the time to suggest members who you would like to represent on the 2016/2017 Board.

Diane Leighton has confirmed that the April and July General Meetings will be held at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church in Yuba City.

NEW BUSINESS:

Tri-Counties Bank is now charging a maintenance fee for one of our accounts. Wendy has contacted them to see if they will consider all three (checking, savings, Quilt Show) accounts when charging this fee. If Tri-Counties doesn't waive this maintenance fee, the Board may change banks before the end of this fiscal year. Due to conflicts with other quilt shows in California, we are considering moving the date of future quilt shows. Moving the Show date may help with our attendance and securing vendors who participate in these other shows. A motion was made and seconded (Matsumoto/Gaines) and unanimously voted to change the date of the quilt show to the second weekend in March if we can reserve the Fairgrounds. DeRay will work with the local 20/30 club and the Fairgrounds to see if this date can work for us in the future.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Programs have been booked through April 2017. DeRay Jensen will have the Featherweight Machine maintenance class on February 27 in the Board Room. There is still room in this class. All workshops through June will be also be held at the Board Room.

QUILT SHOW: There is a meeting tonight at 5:00 p.m. DeRay received notice that the man handling security during the Show is retiring. A discussion was held on the duties of the guard and the Guild's liability during the Show. It was motioned and seconded (D.Jensen/Jagerhorn) and unanimously voted on to discontinue providing security during the Show. The former company provided 24-hour coverage at a cost of \$600 per show. The Fairgrounds staff secure and open the building daily and are available by radio during the Show hours.



NINE PATCH

CARD TRICK

COLOR- Select four (4) gold or gold related fabrics.

From each fabric cut two small triangles and two Targe triangles


Cut four muslin small triangles and four large muslin triangles.

DIRECTIONS

Add 1/4" seam allowance to all pieces.

1- Cut fabric
2- Lay out pieces to form block
3- Sew according to steps 1,2,3,
4- Sew rows together and press
5.-Block should measure 12½ inches
6- Embroider your name on lower right muslin.

STEP 1 ROW 1 UNIT A Sew the 2 large triangles together Sew 2 small triangles together and then to the largest triangle. UNIT B Sew the 2 large triangles together UNIT C STEP 2 ROW 2 UNIT A Sew triangles together Sew the 2 sets of small triangles together using the butted seam UNIT B technique UNIT C Repeat A STEP 3 Sew as row 1 ROW 3

Helpful Hints from Alyce

If you order fabric thru a catalog or online, save the selvage edge that identifies the manufacturer and fabric line. Then if you need more, there is a better chance of finding additional fabric.

When mailing a fragile item (like cookies), use the batting trimmed from a quilt as packing material.

Instead of wearing gloves when quilting, try using Sort Kwik or similar substance to give your fingers extra grip on the fabric. It's less bulky than gloves.

Want smoother batting? Run an acrylic ruler lightly over the batting to smooth it out.
