QUILT SHOW ENTRIES and LAYOUT...Quilt Show Entries are closed, our Show has been laid out with a total of 290 Entries. 31 Challenge Quilts, 198 Red & White and 61 Regular Entries. Members, you have out done yourselves this year, it should be an outstanding show!!!

Important Dates and things to remember:

- Your Card/Receipt with your entry numbers will be available at the February 28th General Meeting. Please stop by our table and pick up your Card/Receipt (with cloth labels attached). If you have a friend who cannot attend this meeting, please pick up their card also. The entry numbers are to be written on your label. The label is to be sewn to the back of the quilt, so when the front of your quilt is facing you, pick up the lower right corner and the label should be clearly visible on the back.
- If for some unforeseen reason you cannot deliver your Quilt/Article please contact us immediately!!!
- 4" Sleeves are required on ALL QUILTS 36" or larger. NO Exceptions will be made this year.
- **<u>Delivery</u>** Please fold your quilt with the label clearly showing on the outside.
- We do not store or keep any pillow cases, bags, hangars, etc. Please take these items with you once the delivery has been made.
- <u>Delivery Date</u> Please deliver your Quilt/Article on Friday, March 9th to the Yuba Sutter Fair Grounds on Franklin Rd. between the hours of 8 a.m. to 10 a.m.
- <u>Pickup Date</u> Please pick up your quilt after the Show, March 11th between the hours of 5 to 5:30 p.m.

You MUST BRING YOUR CARD/RECEIPT to pick up your Quilt/Article.

ALL QUILTS 36" OR LARGER MUST HAVE SLEEVES ON THEM THIS YEAR!!!

QGNQ ~ Quilt Guilds of the North Quarter

We had another really big group attend the meeting – approx. 77 were in attendance. We met in the conference room at Gold Country Casino and had at least 8 opportunity quilts on display. I was able to add 6 quilt shows to my ongoing list of shows.

One topic discussed was: Make sure you file all your guild reports, such as the raffle report due every year. Another item brought up was the rising cost of guild liability insurance. The group in Southern California known as SCCQG (similar to NCQC) offers guild insurance for an extremely low rate, however it does not cover any property the guild might own. Several guilds have joined SCCQG for the basic liability insurance, and plan to self-insure for any property the guild may own. In doing this they decided to set aside funds every year to help cover the loss or damage done to any of the guild assets. This will be a lot cheaper in the long run than having to pay the high insurance rates every year.

The next meeting will be hosted by the Scott Valley Quilters of Etna on April 28. The weather should be nice and the wild flowers starting to bloom, so it should be a good weekend trip. Come join us if you can.

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING

February 12, 2018

Call to order: A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held at 519 D Street in Marysville on February 12, 2018. It was called to order by President Janell Willis at 4:06 pm.

President remarks:

Janell welcomed members. She stated that there are members of our Guild that are ill, facing surgery, and lost loved ones. She reminded us of the importance to be kind to others.

Secretary: A motion was made and seconded (Diane/Gloria) to accept January minutes as written. Unanimous vote to approve.

Correspondence was received from Gwen from Yountville Veterans Home Holiday Gift Project thanking the Guild for our involvement in this project. They are very thankful for all they received. The effort put into shopping, and transporting the items is greatly appreciated!

Treasurer: Checking balance as of February 1, 2018: \$7,903.67. Savings balance is \$16,071.62.

Vice President: Speakers are confirmed through April.

Unfinished Business:

Filing of 1099's. Diana C. and Sharon Easter completed the task. In addition, the RRFI's are filed and the annual sales tax documents are completed.

Quilt Show updates:

DeRay stated that all is going well. The people in charge of the various committees are doing an outstanding job and on schedule. There will be sign ups at the February Guild meeting for any additional help they will need for setup and the days of the Quilt Show.

We currently have 260 quilts entered with 200 of those being red and white. Eight (8) Guilds have submitted their red and white quilt for the Featured Quilts Section of our show. We have 20 Vendors.

Camp Singer youth will be helping again this year with set-up on Friday. We still need more members to sign up to help with set-up.

Presale tickets are still available.

The Prospect booklet put out by the Appeal Democrat was in error. There is NO country store on Saturday.


