LAST CALL FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES....Members, many of you picked up your entry forms for the 2017 "On The Road Again" Quilt Show at the October, or November/December meeting. If you haven't done so, please take a few moments to complete and bring them with you to the January General Meeting. If you haven't picked up your entry forms, please stop by our table to pick them up, and complete them the night of the Meeting. As a reminder each entry is required to have a separate Entry Form, accurate measurements, photo, and/or color swatches, so bring them with you the night of the meeting. (Your Challenge project will also need an entry form, this is the only time where the size or a photo **is not** required.)

**Judged Quilts:** This will require a separate entry form (so this is 2 entry forms which need to be completed if you wish to have your quilt judged). The **Judged Quilt Category only, has a \$5.00 fee for each quilt.** Please think about having 1 or 2 or your quilts judged. This is always a good learning experience.

## Dates to Remember:

- 1. Last date to accept Entries: January 25<sup>th</sup>, at the General Meeting.
- 2. Delivery of JUDGED ITEMS ONLY: Thursday, March 19, 2017 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:30 to 9:30 a.m.
- 3. Delivery of <u>Regular Quilt Exhibits</u>: Friday, March 18, 2017 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

**4.** Entry #'s: You must pickup your Entry Number(s) which will be on a 3"x5" Card/Receipt at the February 22<sup>nd</sup>, VQG General Meeting. The number(s) needs to be put on a label, and the label needs to be sewn to the back of your quilt, in lower right hand corner. This Card/Receipt is also needed to claim your entry.

**5. Pickup:** Quilts must be picked up on 3/19/17, after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. BRING YOUR CARD/ RECEIPT.

Remember...your entry does not have to be finished right now, but must be completed by the Quilt Show. Our Quilt Show this year will be held March 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at the Yuba-Sutter Fair Grounds. Give us a call if you have any questions and have a wonderful Holiday Season!!

# Board Meeting Minutes

## VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING January 9, 2017

**MEMBERS PRESENT**: Diane Leighton, Diane Steele, Colleen Pelfrey, Cathy Evans, Heather Chambers, Sharon Easter, Billie Lindgren, Janet Craver, Carleen Hagen, Carolyn McCray, Wanda Horn and Theresa Mihalyi

**CALL TO ORDER**: The meeting was called to order at 4:06 pm by President Diane Steele.

President remarks: Christmas party was a huge success, well attended.

**Vice President** Listed upcoming speakers and workshops. Rideout Conference Room at Fremont reserved for Saturday after the quilt show. Need volunteer to open room for a sew day there.

**SECRETARY**: A motion was made and seconded (Billie/Cathy) and unanimously voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the November 14, 2016, 2016 Board Meeting and accept the minutes as written. Jennifer Rood wrote Butte Vista asking for bibs to be made. Fabric was made available by Community Service for Yuba City High School students to make them. Carolyn was given the letter for action. The Veteran's Administration sent a thank you letter for the gifts given at the Christmas party. California Board of Equalization sent a post card reminder of a reporting requirement due by January 31, 2017. Action for Treasurer.

**TREASURER:** Theresa reported that the checking account balance is \$9,288.24 and savings is \$16067.72. Discussion on budget to ensure everyone understands the budget entries, how the statements are used, and what fiscal and calendar year reports are needed. President Diane Leighton requested that board members get copies of the Treasurer's Report a week before the board meetings.

## UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

More payment/claim vouchers for the Quilt Guild and Quilt Show account were purchased due to immediate need. A motion was made/unanimously approved (Janet/Carleen) to reimburse the amount paid. Agenda item to adjust the budget to include money for the forms scheduled for the February meeting.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Will ask Linda, Sunshine Chairman, if she can send message to dropped members. Former rosters will be looked at to make it easier to contact them.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS:

**Membership:** There were 143 members in the 2015/2016 year, and 141 members in the 2016/2017 year. Thirteen members have been added since the roster was published. There are 5 lifetime members and 6 junior members. Continued discussion from last month on encouraging lapsed members to rejoin.

QUILT SHOW: Next meeting on the 24<sup>th</sup> at noon.

**Opportunity quilt** has made over \$2100. \$181 from the Christmas Stroll in Yuba City, \$113 at a craft sale, and \$175 at Gridley.

**NCQC:** Sharon stated that dues for 2 year membership in NCQC is now due.

**Christmas Party:** Refund of security deposit received and given to treasurer. Deposit for next year's party has already been sent. Party date is reserved for Wednesday, December 6, 2017. Whiteaker Hall is getting a makeover. Walls have been painted and kitchen may get some upgrades as well. The basket raffle made \$833.00. Ticket sales were \$1440.00, and caterer cost was -\$1438.71. Vendor provided fat quarters cost - \$200. Net was a gain of \$634.29 since members took charge of decorating the tables and absorbed other minor expenses at no cost to the guild.

# Helpful Hints from Alyce

Insects are attracted to starch, so don't store starched fabric for a long period of time. Otherwise the insects will cause holes in your fabric.

To help remove the little threads left in the seams after ripping, just run a soft pencil eraser over the area.

Lost the cap to your seam ripper? Try using a cork on the tip to avoid the sharp point.

To secure the loose end of thread on a spool or bobbin, try using a small pony-tail elastic

#### on them.

When hand sewing you may find the thread keeps tangling. Try running the thread over a bar of soft soap (like Ivory soap).

To organize dangling cords (like on your iron, etc.), fold it over several times and slip it into an empty toiled paper roll.

To keep pieces of fusible interfacing flat, use a gallon-size Ziploc bag fitted with two pieces of cardstock. Then place the interfacing pieces between the cardstock and slide it into the bag. If the exact color of thread is not available, use thread a shade or two darker. It will appear to be the same color of the

#### project.

To remove fresh blood from fabric, moisten a small piece of fabric or cotton ball with your saliva. Rub the spot to remove it.

To remove old blood, try the above technique for fresh blood, then repeat using Hydrogen Peroxide on it.


