Quilt Show Entries ~ 2018

LAST CALL FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES....Members, many of you picked up your entry forms for the 2018 "Rhapsody In Red" Quilt Show at the October and December meetings. Please take a few moments to complete and bring them with you to the January 31st meeting. This will be your last chance to turn in your entries before Layout is done. As a reminder, each entry is required to have a separate Entry Form, photo, and color swatches. Please also include accurate sizes. (Your Challenge project will also need an entry form, this is the only time where the size, description or a photo is not required.)

Dates to Remember:

- Last date to accept Entries: January 31st, at the General Meeting.
- **Delivery** of **Quilt Exhibits**: Friday, March 9th, 2018 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.
- Entry #'s: You must pickup your Entry Number(s) and labels which will be on a 3"x5" Card/Receipt at the February 28th, VQG General Meeting. The number(s) needs to be put on your label, and the label needs to be sewn to the back of your quilt, in lower right hand corner. This Card/Receipt is also needed to claim your entry. Please do not throw it away.
- **Pickup:** Quilts must be picked up on 3/11/18, after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. BRING YOUR CARD/RECEIPT.

Remember, think Red and White...your entry does not have to be finished right now, but must be completed by the Quilt Show. Some members have had questions about other quilt entries, yes they are being accepted. We hope to have enough Red and White quilts to fill the front of our show and aerial display. Our Quilt Show this year will be held March 10th & 11th 2018, at the Yuba-Sutter Fair Grounds. Give us a call if you have any questions.

Helpful Hints from Alyce

Before beginning a project, run the threaded needle through a dryer softener sheet. It reduces the tangling of the thread.

To prevent tangles, thread the needle with the end of the thread that comes off the spool first.

After separating embroidery thread, wrap the unused portion back around

the label of the original skein of thread.

Still can't thread the needle? Turn the eye around. One side is larger and a different slant than the other due to manufacturing.

Wet the eye of the needle instead of the thread. Cut the thread end at a slant to make it go through the eye easier.

Board Meeting Minutes

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING

January 8, 2018

Members Present: Janell Willis, Colleen Pelfrey, Diana Craddock, Sharon Easter, Carleen Hagen, Diane Leighton, Karen Peters, Joetta Danielson, DeRay Jensen and Shirley Jensen.

Call to order: A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held at 519 D Street in Marysville on January 8, 2018. It was called to order by President Janell Willis at 4:01 pm.

President remarks:

Janell welcomed everyone back after the holidays, and hoped everyone got through the holidays.

Secretary: The minutes were read by Colleen Pelfrey in Gloria's absence. A motion was made and seconded (Diane Leighton/Joetta Danielson) to approve the minutes as read. Unanimous vote to approve.

Correspondence: We received a thank—you note from the Veterans Home of California in Yountville. Information from Cooky Amarel was that at the Christmas party guild members donated 50 gift cards, over 650 Christmas cards, over 300 calendars, and toiletries. We also received a card from Lea Veronica of "The Quilters Path" thanking us for past support but informing us that she has decided to discontinue publishing. We also received notification from the California Dept. of Justice concerning missing reports to the attorney general's registry of Charitable Trusts from 2012 to 2016. We have 60 days to retroactively make it right without penalty. Diane Leighton volunteered to take care of it.

Treasurer: Checking balance as of January 8, 2018 is \$7,970.44. Savings balance is \$16,071.62. Diana Craddock expressed that she was having some difficulty with the sales tax reporting. Sharon Easter volunteered to help get it done.

Unfinished Business:

Filing of 1099's: Diana Craddock and Colleen Pelfrey got the information together that is needed to file, but still need assistance to complete the process. Sharon Easter volunteered to help complete the process. Christmas Party Wrap Up: It was agreed that the Christmas Party was a success in all respects. The guild donated a lot of items to several groups, the challenge quilts, the opportunity quilt, and the table decorations looked great, there were a whole lot of hands helping do everything that needed doing, the basket raffle brought in \$879.00, Diane L. sold all but 10 bags of donated fabric, the food was good, and a good time was had by all as far as we know. Carlene Hagen did bring up that she was not able to reserve Whitaker Hall for Christmas 2018 as it might be turned into a homeless shelter. We may need to look into other location possibilities. Janell Willis already has some ideas.

Additional Committees: It was moved and seconded (Karen Peters/Carlene Hagen) that we reinstate the UFO committee to be headed up by Janet Craver. The motion was unanimously passed. We also discussed doing a version of block of the month with pattern only and participants choosing their own fabrics. No action was taken.

Quilt Show: DeRay reported that the quilt show preparations are on track, and we are 60 days out. The publicity group is meeting Wednesday, and has already worked on publicizing the show in a variety of ways. Quilt pins and presale tickets will be available at the January meeting. The January meeting is also when all quilt entries are due. There will also be signup sheets at the January meeting to help with the quilt show. The layout group is meeting the 10th of February. 19 vendors are signed up for the show, and the food vendor will be Yuba College. DeRay shared that the set up for the show will be a little different this year. Nine guilds have responded to his request for a red and white quilt from out of town. And at least one out of town bus full of people will be taking a field trip to visit our show.

New Business:

Quilt Show 2019: There was discussion on theme, possible volunteers to make the opportunity quilt, marketing, publicity, need for a chairperson. No action was taken.

Bylaw Committee: It was moved and seconded (Colleen Pelfrey/Karen Peters) that Diane Leighton head up the bylaw committee, that DeRay Jensen be on the committee, and that they ask one additional member to join them on the committee. Motion unanimously passed.

Committee Reports:

Vice President:

On January 5th & 6th Linda Ballard taught a class on a pattern called "Flying High." 28 people participated in the class. In January, we'll have 3 of our own members present, as well as a little presentation of the history of the quilt guild. In February, the speaker is Sherri McConnell. Her March 2nd & 3rd workshop is a Mahalo quilt. In March, the speaker will be Lynne Pillus, and on March 31 we will have a free sew day. Colleen is hoping some will volunteer to make fidget quilts for Rideout. In April, Anelie Belden will be speaking, with a workshop following on April 28 and 29. Our May speaker cancelled, so is now TBD, but June 2 will be another free sew day. In June is Diana Tatro. In July is Sandy Klop.

Community Service: Diane Leighton still has a garage full of fabric. There were 75 foster quilts donated at the December party. Hopefully some members will help make fidget quilts at the March sew day.

Opportunity Quilt: We sold about \$300 worth of ticket at the Christmas Stroll

Facilities: No report

Membership: Joetta Danielson reported that we currently have 143 members which includes 6 affiliates, 4

juniors, and 5 lifetime members.

Next Board Meeting: February 12th at 519 D St. in Marysville. Meeting begins at 4:00.

Motion was made and seconded (Colleen Pelfrey/Diana Craddock) to adjourn meeting. Unanimous approval. Meeting was adjourned at 5:16 pm.


