

Helpful Hints from Alyce

Need 1/4" tape as a marking line for your quilting? Go to the nearest automotive supply store and ask for 1/4" detail tape. It's similar to what fabric stores carry, and much less expensive.

Save the inside roll from toilet paper. After pressing your binding in half, roll it onto the paper

roller and pin the end piece down. Keeps the binding neat and straight until ready to use.

For borders, trace the pattern onto "Press and Seal" plastic wrap, then press sticky side down onto the border fabric. After stitching the design,

simply tear it away. It's a onetime use only, though.

If you take an extension cord to class, fold it up in about 12" increments. Slide it into a cardboard toilet paper tube. No more tangles!

Board Meeting Minutes

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING July 8, 2015

MEMBERS PRESENT:

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 3:32 pm by President Cooky Amarel. The following announcements were made by Cooky. If any chairpersons need a red binder to let her know. At the general meetings she will be in charge of getting the stage set up. The members will continue to set out additional chairs and put them away after the meeting is over. Quilt holders are desperately needed to hold quilts for the guest speaker. She asked the Board to encourage members to volunteer. A suggestion was made that quilt holders be given a front row seat for the month following their volunteering as a quilt holder. Cooky asked the Board to consider changing the time of the Board meeting. She would like each Board member to give their preference as to what time the meeting should be held and submit the time preference at next month's meeting.

SECRETARY:

A motion was made and seconded (Jagerhorn/Gaines) to approve the minutes as corrected. The correction made was under Unfinished Business and it was the dates of the Fair. The correct dates should read Thursday, July 30, 2015 to Sunday, August 2, 2015. A thank you note from Jan Soules (last month's guest speaker) was read.

TREASURER:

The checking account has a balance of \$368.83 and the savings account has a balance of \$25,562.38.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Fair Set-Up will be on July 21, 2015 at 9:30 am. The Fair staffing will be chaired by Diane Leighton this year. Work shifts will be three hours long this year as requested by the Fair staff. The Fair staff also asked that volunteers carpool to their shifts if at all possible. Cooky also wanted those people that entered items in the fair to know that they are eligible for a \$3.00 discount on a general admission for themselves if they show their entry fee receipt. Cooky announced that a chairperson(s) is needed for the Christmas party this year, otherwise the Board will have to chair it. A second storage unit has been rented for \$20 per month to store the Guild's records that were previously stored at the Guild's Library at Friday Night Live. The interim budget that is required until the final budget is approved on August 12, 2015 was discussed. It was moved and seconded (Wilson/Jagerhorn) to accept the interim budget. A discussion was then held on possible ways to cut some of the Guild's expenses. The Block of the Month program was discussed. Rather than eliminate it completely, possible alternate ways to handle the program were suggested. A chairperson is needed in order for program to be continued.
