

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING

July 8, 2019

Call to Order: A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on July 8, 2019. It was called to order by President, Colleen Pelfrey at 4:01 p.m.

Secretary: Minutes from the June Board Meeting

- 1. Where the minutes reflected a vote for the July 2019 budget, a note was added that this should not have been done until the July meeting.
- 2. The name "Pay May" under Prepare for Changing of the Guard was changed to Pat May.

The motion was made by Cooky Amarel and seconded by Billie Lindgren to accept the June minutes with the identified corrections. A unanimous vote followed.

Treasurer: VQG Treasurer Linda Novak reported that we have a checking balance as of June 30, 2019 of \$9,939.44 and a savings balance of \$20,135.25.

A July working budget was proposed as follows:

465.00 workshops

90.00 Secretary/Treasurer...... **TOTAL \$1,675.00**

Linda Novak then proposed a vote for this interim budget. Billie Lindgren made the motion to approve which was seconded by Carleen Hagen; a unanimous vote followed.

Old Business: Yuba Sutter Fair

1. **Sign-ups**: Billie Lindgren has 36 volunteers who will be given passes and free parking by the fair.

Blocks: Eileen Milligan has the Fair block quilts from last year to sell tickets on this year. Wanda Horn and Carolyn McCray will take in the blocks that were entered this year. Colleen Pelfrey will contact Carolyn McCray to ask if she has arranged for judges for the quilt blocks. It was noted that Rosie Stearns and Charlotte Allee have done it in the past.

New Business

2. **Christmas Party** Whiteaker Hall in Yuba City has been booked and it was decided that the same menu as last year would be used by the same catering company. Janell Willis will be contacted about hiring guards for the event.

New Member Welcome Bags Ginger Benham, suggested getting 25 put together. Possible items to include a So Sew gift card, gifts from Sunsweet, member pins (which need to be located), and ideas for making name tags. She will put a spot on the membership forms to acknowledge member referrals. It was suggested that French Kisses from Sunsweet be gifted to those referring new members. Ginger will submit a budget for this project.

Community Service: Diane Adams of Foster Care will receive quilts at the July meeting.

Opportunity Quilt: The quilt traveled to Red Bluff and raised \$55 and then to Pine Tree where it raised \$71. It will be on display at the Peach Festival.

Quilt Show 2020: Colleen Pelfrey reported that she currently has three vendors lined up.

Membership: Currently there are 183 members. 99 have paid dues, leaving 84 unpaid. If dues are not paid by August, the members name may not make it in time to be included in the yearly VQG roster.
