It is going well. Many unfinished projects are being completed.

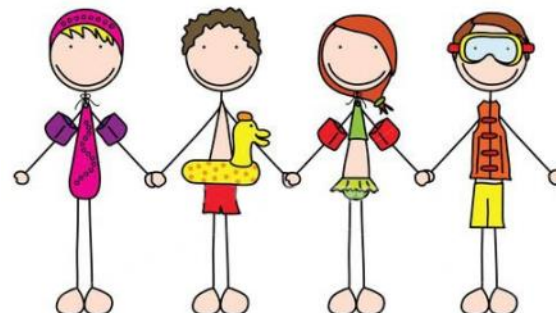
Block of the Month:
