

September 28: Workshop – "Rings of Change"


October 30: Heidi Emmett and Cristine Barnes – Kaffe Fassett Extravaganza



VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING

June 10, 2019

Call to Order:

A meeting of the **Valley Quilt Guild Board** was held on June 10, 2019. It was called to order by President, Janell Willis at <u>4:00</u> pm.

Secretary:

Minutes from May Board Meeting: Colleen Pelfrey's name was spelled with only one L in Colleen and needs to be corrected. The motion was made (Billie Lindgren) and seconded (Carleen Hagen) to accept the May minutes with the identified correction. A unanimous vote followed.

Minutes from May General Meeting – Election of new officers

The motion was made (Colleen Pelfrey) and seconded (Janet Craver) to accept the minutes of the May General Meeting .A unanimous vote followed.

Treasurer: VQG treasurer Diana Craddock reported that we have a checking balance as of June 10,2019 of \$657.39. The savings balance as of June 10,2019 is \$19,076.19.

VQG treasurer Diana Craddock submitted a proposed one- month budget for July, 2019. After reviewing budget, Gloria Adams made a motion that we accept the budget as written. Carleen Hagen seconded the motion. A unanimous vote followed. The completed yearly budget will be submitted at the July Board meeting. At that time, a budget will be approved for expenditures beginning in August and concluded by June 30, 2020.

VQG Quilt Show Treasurer Nikki Snyder provided Colleen Pelfrey with the following information:

The Quilt Show had a profit of \$11,058.02. There is currently \$5,613.85 in the checking account.

Colleen is pleased to report that many members were staying in their current positions.

The known changes are that Joetta Danielson and Karen Peters will no longer be in charge of membership. Ginger Benham has volunteered to assume that responsibility.

Yuba Sutter Fair

We are currently averaging 5 quilts a month for the Cancer Center.

As members donate quilt tops, Gail and Janet are faithfully committed to getting them quilted using a Long Arm Machine. Their devotion is making a huge difference in the number of community service quilts being completed!

Any Changes in agenda or updates: None at this time.

Community Service: No additional information at this time.

Opportunity Quilt: It has recently been taken to Grass Valley, Roseville, and the History Faire for tickets to be sold.

Membership: Renewals have begun. Remember dues are to be paid by July 1, 2019. If not paid by August, the members name may not make it in time to be included in the yearly VQG roster.

Block of the Month: It is going well. Many members are participating. We hope to see many completed blocks at "Show & Tell."

Helpful Hints from Alyce

Save your old sewing machine needles and use them to hang pictures instead of nails. They are just as strong and leave a much smaller hold in the wall.



For cutting templates from plastic sheets, use an old rotary cutting blade. This will leave a smoother and straighter edge on the template.



To keep templates together for each pattern or project, punch a hole in one jcorner and pin them all together with a safety pin.



If the fabric in your project is both light and dark, try using a yellow marking pen or pencil and it will show up equally well on both

colors.

To keep plastic templates from slipping on the fabric, first spray it with a light coating of spray adhesive such as Scotch 3M "Spray

Mount" artist's adhesive. Or use a similar product. Lay template flat and let it dry for a few minutes before using.
