VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING

March 10, 2018

Members Present: Janell Willis, Colleen Pelfrey, Eileen Milligan, Diana Craddick, Gloria Adams, Sharon Easter, Janet Craver, Billy Lindgren, Diane Leighton, Joetta Danielson, Karen Peters, Gail Gilmore, and member Jody Ohrt.

Call to order

A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held at 519 D Street in Marysville on March 10, 2018. It was called to order by President Janell Willis at 4:02 pm.

President remarks:

The quilt show was such a hit! Great attendance! DeRay will give us the statistics at the next general meeting. **Secretary:**

A motion was made and seconded (Colleen/Joetta) to accept February minutes as written. Unanimous vote to approve.

Treasurer:

Checking balance as of February 28, 201 8 is \$7,006.36. Savings balance is \$16,071.62.

Vice President:

We are scheduled with events and speakers through July. Check newsletter for details.

Unfinished Business:

Quilt Show – 2018 wrap up. DeRay did not attend so there was no information given.

Quilt Show-2019

Colleen Pelfrey and Eileen Milligan have agreed to be co-chairmen. They also have volunteered to design and piece the Opportunity Quilt! They need someone to volunteer to guilt it.

The theme is *Heart & Home*. Janell will provide details at our March general meeting.

Billie Lindgren has agreed to be the Chairperson for showing the 2019 Opportunity Quilt at various Guilds and events. However, she stated she hoped she would have more volunteers to take the quilt to other guilds than she had this year. It turned out she had to do a lot of traveling this past year.

It was suggested that we also be thinking about volunteers to be in charge of the 2020 Quilt Show. It would make the show go more smoothly if the volunteers for the 2020 show could job *shadow* the 2019 team. The Board members will be working on getting volunteers so that a smooth transition could take place.

Bylaw Committee update: They will commence with working now that the Quilt Show is over.

Facilities:

Caltrans is secured for the remainder of the calendar year.

A new location is needed for the VQG Christmas Party.

The Ice Cream Social will remain at St. Andrews.

New Business:

Lifetime Membership:

The motion was made and seconded (Karen Peters/Colleen Pelfrey) that Clara Midwood is made a lifetime member of the Valley Quilt Guilt. Her faithful attendance to meetings, commitment to the mission of the Guild, and longevity as a member warrants this recognition. A unanimous vote to approve followed.

Meeting Time:

Janell suggested we consider beginning our monthly quilt meeting at 6:30 instead of 7:00.

- a. Our contract with Caltrans is that we are out of there by 9:00. It has been challenging to comply with that as often we only have 15 minutes to put chairs and tables away.
- b. It would get people home earlier. We have many members driving from the Foothills or farther.
- c. The doors would open at 6:00 as it does now. Members would be encouraged to come between 6 and 6:30 to take care of purchases or to sign up for classes.

No decision was made because the Board decided it was important to get the input of members before making such a change. We want to hear if this would work for the *majority* of our members.

Recycle; ReLove; ReUse

Janell suggested that we pick one meeting night and have a quilt related item(s) exchange. Quilt members bring in quilting items that they would like to **give** to another quilter and also be able to take items that they can use that was **brought** by another quilter. It was suggested that it might work at our ice cream social. Janell will present more information at our next Guild meeting.

Committee Reports:

Vice President Update:

There are two free sew days scheduled for March 31 and June 2. Both will be from 9 am to 3 pm at the Rideout Conference Center.

Treasurer:

Cost of P.O. Box rental was paid (\$82). Clarification was given for how to record the money for 2018/19 membership that is paid before new fiscal year in July.

There were two new electric staplers purchased for VQG.

Community Service:

Diane reported that 2 bolts of batting came in so more quilts can be sewn. It was also suggested that we see if we can have a few sew days on a weekday. In addition, it was also suggested that we set aside at least one Sew Day with an emphasis on getting community service quilts done. It would be similar to when we sewed on Make a Difference Day. It would be a good opportunity to get coverage from the Appeal Democrat on that Sew Day.

Colleen will see about the availability of the Conference Center during the week.

Opportunity Quilt:

Karen Peters was the lucky winner of this year's quilt!

We need more volunteers to travel to sell tickets at other Guilds.

Membership:

We have 10 new members, including one affiliate. That brings our total to 154. Janell suggested we look into getting cards (business size) made to promote out Guild. Joetta will work on that project.

DeRay and Dee Jagerhorn have volunteered to work on the Challenge Quilt for 2019.

Helpful Hints from Alyce

Wipe off your cutting board occasionally with a damp cloth, as accumulated dust has particles that will dull your rotary blade.

When the rotary blade becomes dull, turn it over. This will give you more use of the blade.

Don't forget to lower the presser foot when not sewing, as this releases the pressure on the spring assembly, thus extending it's life. Also turn off the light when not sewing for the same reason.

Don't store quilted items in a cedar chest, as the wooden lining puts off methane gas. In time the gas will rot the fabric. So will unpainted shelving units.

Occasionally disassemble your rotary cutter and wipe the parts to remove built up lint. Then put a drop of oil on the blade, spin it around with a Q-Tip and reassemble in the order removed. This will add life to the blade.

Don't hand-quilt with any hand lotion on your hands. The oil in the lotion will leave a residue on the quilt.
