Our 2018 Quilt Show will our 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Show and will be an event to remember. It is called

"Rhapsody in Red" and will be held the weekend of 10-11 March 2018 at the Yuba-Sutter Fairgrounds. The focus of the show will be on **RED AND WHITE** quilts. I challenged the member at the meeting to make and enter at least one red and white quilt. Will you accept the challenge? Please do so! Can you imagine what the hall will look like with over 200 red and white quilts on display? We are changing the layout for this show and will be hanging some quilts from the high

ceiling so we can spotlight the "Infinite Variety" of red and white quilts on display. I also challenged the member to make their own name badges that correspond with the show. Chris West will be introducing the main quilt challenge for the show in July and it will be very fun, exciting, challenging, and I hope all of you will participate.

**NOTE:** Red and white colors defined means **red is red and white/ off white is white**. Please do not incorporate other colors (like cream, tan, black, etc.) into your quilt.

We also introduced the 2018 Opportunity Quilt and it is a winner.

Buzolich. Tickets will be available
soon. We have postcards and if
you didn't get any, we will have
them available at the next



## Board Meeting Minutes

#### VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING ~ May 8, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 4:20 pm by President Diane Steele.

Officers and Chairpersons present were Diane Steele, Diane Leighton, Theresa Mihalyi, Janet Craver, Sharon Easter, Colleen Pelfrey, Cathy Evans, Wanda Horn, and Billie Lindgren. One guest, Janell Willis, was present.

**President's Comments:** Diane Steele commented that she was very excited about next year's quilt show "Rhapsody in Red". She also shared that Billie Lindgren was going to take on the job of marketing for the opportunity quilt. Diane introduced Janell Willis, who has been nominated for the office of quilt guild president. Janell also shared a little about herself.

**Minutes:** The secretary was absent. Sharon Easter read the minutes from the previous board meeting. Two corrections were made to dates incorrectly reported by Colleen at the last meeting. The "Taking Out the Dye Class" was on April 22, not April 29 and the ice cream social will be in August, not July. Cathy Evans moved and Billie Lindgren seconded to approve the minutes after the corrections were made. The motion was passed unanimously.

**Treasurer's Report:** Theresa Mihalyi reported that our checking account balance was \$8,168.74 and our savings account balance was \$16,069.49.

Between the Treasurer's report and the VP updates, there was some discussion about selling opportunity quilt tickets at the Christmas Stroll. Diane Steele noted that every business on the street gets one free spot at the stroll, and wondered if somebody might know of a business not using their spot who would be willing to let us use it. We also talked about the possibility of participating in the summer stroll, or sharing a spot with another guild to reduce cost of a spot.

Vice Presidents Updates: Colleen noted that neither she nor Cathy Evans would be able to attend the May meeting. Diane Steele volunteered to take care of the speaker, Eileen Milligan, at the dinner with the speaker, and also to introduce her at the guild meeting. Cathy Evans shared the upcoming programs and workshops as follows. This month will be a "Melissa and Mom Trunk Show" by Eileen Milligan. She will be teaching a bag class on 6/3/17. The class is a go. In June, Sarge Furman will present a trunk show. On July 15, Colleen will teach another "Taking Out the Dye Class" and Jennifer Rapacki will present a lecture at the July meeting. She will also teach an EQ7 class (participants will pay her directly) at Cathy's house. On Friday and Saturday, July 28 and 29, 2017, she will teach a class called "Weave That!" It's a beautiful poppy wall hanging. In August, Linda Ballard will teach a class on the 19<sup>th</sup>, and the August meeting will be an ice cream social at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. Sandra Bruce will be doing a class and a lecture in September.

## Board Meeting Minutes

#### **Board Minutes continued...**

#### **New Business:**

1) Diane Steele shared a suggestion to have Vivian Riley and Cathy Evans bring red and white fabric to the August ice cream social. While we thought it was a good idea that led to some discussion about who could vend at quilt guild events. When we looked into the bylaws, it stated that only affiliate members could be vendors. This in turn led to a discussion on affiliate members vs regular members, and the need to clarify how each type of membership is handled. After discussion, Colleen Pelfrey made a motion to have Vivian Riley and Cathy Evans bring red and white fabric to the August ice cream social to sell as an encouragement to members to start making their red and white quilts. The motion was seconded by Theresa Mihalyi, and approved unanimously.

2) Billie Lindgren shared some changes she was making to the membership form. She is simplifying the process for returning members, so they do not have to fill out as much information. She will clarify that an affiliate member may have one person on the membership roster as part of their affiliate membership. She asked how to get the membership form on the guild website and was directed to give it to Ginger Benham. There was some discussion as to how often the roster comes out, as well as the best time to renew memberships. It was agreed that the best time to renew a membership was at the June meeting. The benefits of being an affiliate member were also discussed.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Diane Leighton shared that several community service quilts had been quilted and bound.

Sharon Easter asked for clarification on mileage reimbursement for the NCQC and North Quarter representative. Diane Leighton offered to look it up from a previous meeting and let us know.

It was noted that the next board meeting would be at 4:30 on June 12, 2017 at Diane Leighton's house.

Members were reminded to have newsletter articles in to Kim Buzolich by May 11.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:41pm by president Diane Steele

## Helpful Hints from Alyce

If you need a stabilizer when doing machine applique, try using a coffee filter. It tears away easily.

Use a dryer sheet or a ball of aluminum foil to clean the sole plate of the iron.

Metal hair clips work well to hold the binding in place as y ou sew. Less expensive and works very well.

It helps to keep thread from tangling if it's run over a bar of soft

soap, such as Ivory, hen hand sewing.

If the batting sticks to the cutting board after cutting, just take a small piece of it and rub over the area. It will remove any lint remaining in the grooves.
