Once again, thank you all for your donations. You are amazing. Members donated an additional \$828 at the April meeting, bringing our total donations to \$5,688. Reminder (or new information for new members) concerning signing up for classes:

When the guild sponsors a workshop, we need to know that we have enough participants to go ahead with a workshop by a month before the date of the workshop. That is why we ask you to sign up early and pay. However, we usually do not deposit any checks until we are sure the class is a go. For some people, it might be a concern if the check is held, so we wanted to make you aware that it might happen. If a workshop has to be cancelled, we return your check or cash. If you find you cannot attend, the guild does not refund, but you are welcome to find someone to take your spot.

FAIR TIME! JUNE 22-25, 2023

Don't forget to turn in your entries for both quilts and blocks by May 26!

The deadline for fair entries is fast approaching. I would still like to encourage you to enter a quilt in the fair, or to enter the quilt block contest. Entry fee for a quilt is \$2. There is no fee to enter a quilt block (but you don't get your block back). Those blocks get turned in to raffle quilts for the following year. You can enter online, or you can enter with a paper form. Deadline for entries is May 26, 2023. Even though there is no fee, entry forms are required for entering the quilt block contest. The blocks need to be 12 ½ inches square, and red, white and blue. Do you maybe have some red, white and blue scraps from quilts you made for the show?

To access information and entries online, go to ysfair.com

- 1. Click on General Fair Information
- 2. Click on the small white rectangle (a pull down menu) in the upper left corner
- 3. Click on Exhibits

That will take you to the page with information and either online entries, or an entry form you can print. You can also pick up a paper entry form at the fair office.

I also need help with set up (not sure which day yet) and with volunteers to be at the table in the building, keep an eye on things, and sell raffle tickets during the fair. This year's 3 raffle quilts will be at the May meeting if you want to buy a ticket early.

I'll also have volunteer sign up sheets at the May meeting, and could still use some help. If you aren't going to be at the meeting, but would be willing to work a shift, please email or call me.

Board Meeting Minutes

VQG BOARD MEETING

Monday, May 8, 2023 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

I. Call to Order: A Meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on May 8, 2023, at the Crossroads Community Church. It was called to order at 4:01 pm.

II. Announcements and additions to the agenda:

Add: Old Business - B. Fair and Ladders; C. Poles and Drapes

III. Secretary: Cathy Klaker thanked Eileen for filling in as secretary for the last 2 meetings. A motion to approve the minutes of the January meeting as written was made by Colleen Pelfrey and seconded by Deanna Williams. <u>A unanimous vote to approve followed.</u>

IV. Treasurer: We have a Checking balance of \$4,631.81 and a Savings balance of \$19,947.03 for a total of \$24,578.84 minus the Poles and Drapes fund of \$4,860.00 for an available balance of \$19,718.84. The Quilt Show balance is \$5,358.33. Poles and Drapes is now a new line item in the budget. It was noted that any membership dues and class fees for next year should be held then moved to next fiscal year.

V. Old Business

A. We need new officers – Carlene will ask for volunteers to fill vacant board positions and put the job descriptions for the positions in the newsletter.

B. Fair and Ladders – The ladders for the fair will cost \$65 each. The funding for the ladders will come out of the fair bank account. A motion to purchase 4 ladders for up to \$300 total was made by Diane Leighton and seconded by Jan Thompson. A unanimous vote to approve followed. Colleen will purchase the ladders.

C. Poles and Drapes – A motion to purchase the rest of the quilt show poles and drapes by the end of the fiscal year was made by Diane Leighton and seconded by Eileen Mulligan. A unanimous vote to approve followed. Colleen will order the poles and drapes before the prices go up and coordinate the storage with Cookie and Pat May.

VI. New Business:

Tickets for opportunity quilt hosts – The guild has received free tickets for the guild president(s) to the quilt shows of guilds who sponsored our opportunity quilt at their meetings. It was suggested that we do the same for guilds who bring their opportunity quilts to our meetings. It was decided to check with Janell Willis, the 2024 Quilt Show Chair.

- **C. Membership**: Nicki Lura reported that we have 171 members (5 returning and 6 new), and 10 affiliates. It was agreed that Nicki would purchase a new date stamp for the membership cards.
- **D. Quilt Show**: The \$700 cleaning deposit for this year's quilt show has been returned by the fairgrounds and deposited in next year's show account.
- **E. Opportunity Quilt 2024:** The top is complete and should be quilted in time for the May Meeting. The wind-sock is half-way done.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 4:55 pm.

The next Board Meeting will be Monday, June 12, 2023 at 4:00 pm at Community Crossroads Church.
