Quilt Show Entries

IT'S QUILT SHOW ENTRY TIME....Members, many of you picked up your entry forms for the 2017 "On the Road Again" Quilt Show at the October meeting. Please take a few moments to complete and bring them with you to the Nov/Dec. Christmas Dinner, on Wednesday, December 7th. If you haven't picked up your entry forms, please stop by our table to pick them up. As a reminder each entry is required to have a separate Entry Form, photo, and/or color swatches. Please also include accurate sizes. (Your Challenge project will also need an entry form, this is the only where the size or a photo **is not** required.)

Judged Quilts: This will require a separate entry form (so this is 2 entry forms which need to be completed if you wish to have your quilt judged). The **Judged Quilt Category only, has a \$5.00 fee for each quilt.** Please think about having 1 or 2 or your quilts judged. This is always a good learning experience.

Dates to Remember:

- 1. Last date to accept Entries: January 25th, at the General Meeting.
- 2. Delivery of JUDGED ITEMS ONLY: Thursday, March 19, 2017 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:30 to 9:30 a.m.
- 3. Delivery of Regular Quilt Exhibits: Friday, March 18, 2017 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.
- **4.** Entry #'s: You must pickup your Entry Number(s) which will be on a 3"x5" Card/Receipt at the February 22nd, VQG General Meeting. The number(s) needs to be put on a label, and the label needs to be sewn to the back of your quilt, in lower right hand corner. This Card/Receipt is also needed to claim your entry.
- **5. Pickup:** Quilts must be picked up on 3/19/17, after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. BRING YOUR CARD/ RECEIPT.

Remember...your entry does not have to be finished right now, but must be completed by the Quilt Show. Our Quilt Show this year will be held March 18th & 19th,

2017 at the Yuba-Sutter Fair Grounds. Give us a call if you have any questions and have a wonderful Holiday Season!!

Board Meeting Minutes

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING November 14, 2016

MEMBERS PRESENT: Diane Leighton, Diane Steele, Colleen Pelfrey, Heather Chambers, Sharon Easter, Billie Lindgren, Janet Craver, Carleen Hagen, Millie Berryhill, Carolyn McCray, Wanda Horn and DeRay Jensen

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 4:20 pm by President Diane Steele.

President remarks: Jody did great job as speaker. Having guild members as speakers helps members not only learn about the quilter and the craftsmanship, but also to learn about the person. Would like to see more. **Christmas Stroll** has people signed up for each time period. There will be Community Service quilts there as well as VQG brochures.

Vice President: Linda Ballard has workshop January 13-14. No guest speaker for January meeting. Instead, will spend time on Quilt Show information, plus have several members speaking about their quilts. Speaker Colleen will be the **February** speaker. **March** will have quilt show wrap up and several quilters (up to five) who will each speak for 10 minutes about 5 of their quilts.

SECRETARY: A motion was made and seconded (Billie/DeRay) and unanimously voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the October 10, 2016 Board Meeting and accept the minutes as written.

TREASURER: Absent, but provided the information that the checking account balance is \$6776.39 and savings is \$16066.72.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Christmas Party Planning: There are enough volunteers to decorate all tables. Set up time 10:00 am to put up tables, chairs, and quilts on frames. Carleen is making sure that VQG members have access to building. At 3:00 pm, people will decorate the tables. Vendor is Friends Around the Block. Motion Colleen/Carlene) was made and unanimously carried to authorize up to \$250 to purchase 100 fat quarters from the vendor. Heather will provide additional fat quarters to ensure there are enough fat quarters for each attendee. There will be raffle and door prizes. Heather will work with Pat to get raffle tickets for dinner. Guild will provide candies for the tables. Diane Steele and Colleen Pelfrey have a program for the evening.

NCQC mileage allowance: Motion made and seconded to create a new budget category to provide a partial mileage allowance of \$35 for the NCQC Rep for each meeting attended. The rep will provide a write up of the NCQC meeting for the VQG newsletter. Additionally, both vice presidents will receive \$35 for up to two NCQC meetings each that are attended. Motion was unanimously approved.

VQG Promotion category: A motion (Janet/DeRay) was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to create a new budget category for VQG promotion with a budget of \$400 to be adjusted as needed. Line items and budget are: \$250 for Arts Council and Chamber of Commerce; \$50 for Christmas Stroll

Budget for Fat Quarter: A motion (Billie/Carleen) was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to authorize \$25 for Fat Chance.

Some vendors are signed up for the show already.
