Dee Campbell and I made the trip to Burney. I had already looked Burney up on the computer to see if there were any quilt shops in the area. There are!!

Burney Fabric and Crafts is located at 37118 Hwy 299 East. If you are going to be going through Burney before Thanksgiving, you might want to stop by and see what they have. They are going out of business and will probably be closing about that time. They are open until 5 during the week, and until 4 on Saturday. The have a nice selection of fabric upstairs on the mezzanine. It's not huge, but what they have is nice. Downstairs is the yarn and other craft items, already well picked over.

After leaving Burney, we took the road to Palo Cedro (where Linda Ballard lives) and went to Blue Iris Quilt Shop. I've only been there one other time. They have a nice selection of fabrics. Then we hustled to get to Red Bluff and the Stitch by Stitch quilt shop on Hickory Street just around the corner from Bank of America on Main St. They are the drop off site for fat quarters for the burn victims in the Santa Rosa are. We collected a large number of fat quarters at the QGNQ meeting to help their cause.

After leaving Red Bluff we took Hwy 99 through Los Molinos and stopped at Sew Smart Supplies. This is a really small quilt shop in downtown Los Molinos on the east side of the road. They may be small but they have a nice selection of fabrics, and are always willing to open up if you are there after hours. We arrived about 4:30. They were still there (they close at 3 on Saturday), saw us drive up, and unlocked the door. It was after 5 when we left. I saw them at the Red Bluff quilt show just before they opened their shop. If you haven't picked up your entry forms, please stop by our table to pick them up. As a reminder each entry is required to have a separate Entry Form, photo, and color swatches. Please also include accurate sizes.

(Your Challenge project will also need an entry form, this is the only time where the size, description or a photo **is not** required.)

Dates to Remember:

Last date to accept Entries: January 31st, at the General Meeting.

Delivery of Quilt Exhibits: Friday, March 9th, 2018 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

Entry #'s: You must pickup your Entry Number(s) and labels which will be on a 3"x5" Card/Receipt at the February 28th, VQG General Meeting. The number(s) needs to be put on your label, and the label needs to be sewn to the back of your quilt, in the lower right hand corner. **This Card/Receipt is also needed to claim your entry. Please do not throw it away!**

Pickup: Quilts must be picked up on 3/11/18, after the show from 5-5:30 BRING YOUR CARD/RECEIPT to claim your entry.

Remember, think Red and White...your entry does not have to be finished right now, but must be completed by the Quilt Show. Other colors are acceptable.

Our Quilt Show this year will be held March 10th & 11th 2018, at the Yuba-Sutter Fair Grounds. Give us a call if you have any questions and have a wonderful Holiday Season!

Helpful Hints from Alyce

When fusing wool to a background fabric, use a heavyweight fusible material. The wool will adhere better.

Use a steam iron cleaner periodically to clean your iron. It also removes any fusible adhesive from sticking to it, especially if you do any fusible applique.

Don't handle fabric or quilting projects if you have lotion on your hands. The lotion will leave a residue on your fabric or projects.

Don't store quilts in cedar chests or wooden containers as they put off methane gas which will rot the fabric. Don't put them on bare wood shelves for the same reason.
