Our goal is 100 Quilts but with some help from some amazing quilting companies spreading the word we hope to at least double that. Thank you for all you do for people, I have said it before but I am honored to be a part of a group that is so giving and at times like these it is important to tell you. You never know what can happen in a moment.

If you haven't picked up your entry forms, please stop by our table to pick them up. As a reminder each entry is required to have a separate Entry Form, photo, and/or color swatches. Please also include accurate sizes. (Your Challenge project will also need an entry form, this is the only time where the size, description or a photo **is not** required.)

Dates to Remember:

Last date to accept Entries: January 31st, at the General Meeting.

Delivery of Judged Exhibits ONLY: Thursday, March 7th, 2019 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

Delivery of **Quilt Exhibits**: Friday, March 8th, 2019 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a m

Entry #'s: You must pickup your Entry Number(s) and labels which will be on a 3"x5" Card/Receipt at the February 27th, VQG General Meeting. The number(s) needs to be put on your label, and the label needs to be sewn to the back of your quilt, in lower right hand corner. This Card/Receipt is also needed to claim your entry. Please do not throw it away.

Pickup: Quilts must be picked up on 3/11/18, after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. BRING YOUR CARD/RECEIPT.

Helpful Hints from Alyce

When using freezer paper for applique and you need more than one template, cut the paper in the approximate size and repeat however many you need. Stack one on top of another and lightly press with a hot iron. Keep stacking and pressing, then trace the pattern on the top sheet and cut. Thus several copies are made at once.

If a more subtle color is needed, try using the back side of the fabric. It may enhance the quilt better than the front side.

Don't forget to use a steam iron cleaner periodically to clean the sole plate of the iron. It's important to remove any residue that has accumulated on it.

For a warmer quilt, use prewashed wool fabric instead of the traditional batting. Even an extra thick/heavy flannel will provide extra warmth. Prewash to allow for shrinkage.

When cutting fabric, place the edge of the cutter next to the ruler (at a slight angle), rather than

straight up and down. This gives a more accurate cut as the ruler keeps the blade steady.
