Last year at this time, the impact of the Camp Fire was heavy on our hearts and minds as we tried to do what we could to support the survivors of the fire. Many quilts from our guild, and indeed from many other guilds as well, were given to friends, family and strangers as we hoped to pass on a little love and comfort.

Last week I had the honor of being invited to the Paradise Quilt Guild's November meeting. They were honoring people who had in some way given to their guild as they were struggling to keep their guild alive in the midst of the chaos in their lives. One of their members had written something about each person they were honoring, and read it as each person was thanked. There was everything from people who facilitated getting donations of fabric, quilts, and quilting supplies to people who needed them, to the Chico Quilt

Guild who gave everyone in the Paradise Guild a free membership in the Chico Guild, to collecting house blocks from all over the world to be made into house quilts, to donating time to present a lecture or a workshop and putting a smile on a face that needed a smile. The emotion still ran high, and tears came easily, but the attitude was one of being thankful. During the next part of the meeting, they talked of giving back. The members of their guild are back to making quilts for others in need, and have made a good number of quilts to be donated. During show and tell, many of the guilts had stories somehow connected to the fire. One was one of the house block guilts, made from house blocks sent from all over. It even had a few blocks from France. The maker said it helped to know that the blocks were from people who cared ... and there are people

who care all over.

Here's what I saw. I saw grateful. People who lost everything, grateful for the care shown to them by others. I saw resilience. Taking what you have, and working towards making it better. Taking scraps if you will, and making quilts. And I saw giving. Knowing that you still can give, and understanding the joy that comes from giving. I thought it was a good reflection of the holiday season: giving thanks for our blessings, and giving of ourselves to others. I see those things in you all as well, and I'm thankful to be a part of our guild. Wishing you all much joy in the coming season!

Christmas Party Reminders


- * If you are decorating a table or otherwise helping with set up, you can come at 2:00 pm or later as long as you are done setting up by 6:00 pm

Quilt Show Entries

IT'S QUILT SHOW ENTRY TIME....Please take a few moments to complete your entry forms and bring them with you to the Nov/Dec. Christmas Dinner, on Wednesday December 4th.

As a reminder each entry is required to have a separate Entry Form, photo, and/or color swatches. Please also include **accurate sizes**.

Your Challenge project will also need an entry form, this is the only time where the size, description or a photo **is not** required.

Judged Quilts: Judged Quilts <u>ONLY</u> require a \$5.00 entry fee, and in addition to the Regular Entry form you are required to complete a separate Judged Entry form. (2 entry forms will be needed). **Judged Quilts** <u>ONLY</u> are to be delivered on Thursday, March 14th. Between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.

Dates to Remember:

Last date to accept Entries: January 29th, at the General Meeting.

Delivery of **Quilt Exhibits**: Friday, March 13th, 2020 at the Y-S Fair Grounds, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

Entry #'s: You must pick up your Entry Number(s) and labels which will be on a 3"x5" Card/ Receipt at the February 26th, VQG General Meeting. The number needs to be put on your label, and the *label needs is to be sewn to the back of your quilt, in the lower left-hand corner.*

This Card/Receipt is also needed to claim your entry. Please do not throw it away.

Pickup: Quilts must be picked up on 3/15/20, after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. BRING YOUR CARD/RECEIPT.

Your entry does not have to be finished right now, but must be completed by the Quilt Show. Articles must be finished and in good condition. In order to have a new show each year, we ask that you not enter items previously shown in a VQG Show during the last 5 years.

You **MUST** be a current VQG Member to exhibit in the show. Please limit your entries to 5 per member (if you have additional special quilts for display, please call Pat or Cooky.)

Our Quilt Show this year will be held March 14th & 15th, 2020, at the Yuba-Sutter Fair Grounds. Give us a call if you have any questions.

We met at the Westside Grange in Red Bluff and had an estimated 50 in attendance, including a representative from Fort Bragg and another from Fall River Mills. Lunch was make-it-your-way sliders along with two kinds of soup and a bunch of salads made by the Red Bluff ladies. All were delicious as usual.

The topic for discussion was all about quilt shows. The general consensus was that all were charging under \$10 for admission. Several have boutiques and/ or country stores and all agreed that merchandise on consignment was a lot more work than it was worth. The main reason for not having a country store involved the competition with the vendors, but a boutique was a good way to make money without competing for their sales of like-kind merchandise. At least one guild allows all husbands to attend free when accompanied by their wife. Others have husbands help with set up and take down and provide them with dinner or lunch for their assistance. Some guilds have a layout of a few quilts, then a vendor or two, then more quilts, and repeat this all throughout the show. Some visitors tend to get overwhelmed by the number or quilts or bored by seeing so many quilts without a "break in the action".

For those interested, there is a new "Mostly Modern Quilters" group in Chico, meeting at the Chico Library on the third Wednesday every month at 7 pm. Check with Annie Star guild to be sure I have the right day.

Helpful Hints from Alyce

For sewing machines with a smooth base (such as a Singer Featherweight), wax the base with CAR was (not furniture wax) on it. The fabric will glide more smoothly through the feed dogs.

Hardware stores have a wide selection of masking tape in various widths. It can be used for marking straight lines as both lines can be used when quilting. This eliminates the need for marking, and the tape can be used several times.

Use machine embroidery thread when doing machine applique. The results are better than using polyester thread, which can cause puckering.


