Helpful Hints from Alyce

Try using an old sewing machine Needle to pull out the corners of an item instead of using a regular needle or straight pin. It is not only stronger, but has a thicker end to hold onto.

Overburdened with scraps? Take time to cut them into usable squares starting with the largest one. Example: 8x8 then a 4x4, down to the smallest size you will use, such as 2-1/2x 2-1/2.

To tell if a piece of fabric is 100% cotton or a blend, do the burn test. Using a match or candle, burn a very small section or threads. If it leaves an ash, it's 100% cotton. If it's beaded, it's a blend or a synthetic fabric.

When giving a quilted item as a gift, be sure to include care instructions. You can write them in permanent ink on white fabric, then applique it to the back. The recipient will know how to care for your gift.

Board Meeting Minutes

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING November 12, 2014

MEMBERS PRESENT: Cooky Amarel, Claire Poole, Cheryl Gaines, Wendy Cockrell, Linda Matsumoto, Margaret Brazelton, Cathy Evans, Delaina Watson, Carolyn McCray, Carleen Hagen, Nancy Wilson, Kim Buzolich, Sharon Easter, Diana Tatro, Jody Ohrt, and Ginger Benham.

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 12:18 pm by President Cooky Amarel.

SECRETARY: A motion was made and seconded (Cockrell/Ohrt) and unanimously voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the October 8, 2104 Board Meeting. A motion was made and seconded (Cockrell/Evans) and unanimously voted to approve the minutes as corrected with four typographical changes. There was no correspondence.

TREASURER: The checking accounting has a balance of \$11,688.59 and the savings account has a balance of \$16,060.53. The Federal Income Tax form 990N and State Income Tax form 199N has been filed for the the 2013/14 tax year.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Wendy's husband has done some research on the costs and numbers for the portable microphones. There was discussion on the compatibility to the Caltrans podium and the fact we will still need an amplifier offsite. Carolyn reported on finalizing plans and prizes for the Christmas party. There are approximately 100 paid members for the dinner.

The Red Shirts for our annual quilt show have arrived and will be dispensed to the appropriate people at the January Quilt Show Meeting.

Jody and Cooky visited a vendor in Sacramento to explore the design and costs for the 310 Club and Totally Me pins. After a review of the costs it was moved and seconded (Gaines/Evans) and unanimously approved to increase the budget for the 310 Club by \$25.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cooky requested we explore purchasing Past Presidents pins for the Guild. A discussion was held on the design and costs and Wendy will provide information from the Sacramento 20/30 Club and the pins they use. It was moved and seconded (Matsumoto/Evans) and unanimously voted to increase the Property budget by \$300 for several items that need replacement.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Claire reported that there will be a Newcomers dinner prior to the January General Meeting. The dinner was very well received last year and many questions were answered regarding Guild activities/programs. All Board Members are encouraged to attend also. A reminder will go out in January and reservations will be mandatory. Cheryl will work up a diagram of the General Meeting table layouts. It will include labels that designate which function (i.e. Community Service, BOQ, etc.) is at each table so the same setup is followed each month. It will make it easier for members to find those tables each month if we have the same setup.
