Quilt Show Entries

Quilt Show Entries – Members...it's time to start thinking about your Quilt Show entries. Our 2015 Quilt Show "Not Your Grandma's Quilt" will be held on March 21 & 22, 2015.

We will have Rules of Entry and Quilt Show Entry Forms for both Regular (Non-Judged) and Judged Entries (printed in RED) available at our table, so please stop by at the meeting and pick yours up.

Think about having your entry judged this year. It's a great learning experience for any quilter.

Things to Remember:

All entries must have a completed Regular Entry form.

Accurate measurements.

Fabric swatches.

Photos.

You must be a VQG Member to enter. (Please encourage anyone who wishes to enter to join the Guild).

The entries per person are limited to 5. However, if you have an additional wonderful quilt and wish to show it, please let us know.

Judges Entries:

Judged Entries ONLY require a \$5.00 fee.

You MUST complete 2 Entry Application if your entry is being Judged. (Regular Entry Form & a

Judged Entry Form).

Judged Entries ONLY must be turned in for judging on 3/19/15.

Important Dates to Remember:

Last Date to accept entry applications – VQG General Meeting 1/28/15.

Entry Numbers will be handed out at the VQG General Meeting on 2/25/15. (The Entry # is assigned to your quilt/article and needs to be placed on your quilt/article. This card needs to be saved as it is your receipt to pick up your quilt/article at the end of the show).

Delivery – Your quilt/article must be delivered to the Yuba Sutter Fairground on Friday, March 20th, 2015 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and are to arrive no later than 10:00 a.m.

Pickup – Quilts must be picked up on Sunday, March 22nd, 2015 after the show from 5-5:30 p.m. Bring your Card/Receipt to claim your quilt/entry.

Helpful Hints from Alyce

Alyce Kauffman has generously volunteered to provide hints and tips for the newsletter. Enjoy!

★ If your needle is difficult to thread, turn the eye around. The way it's manufactured gives a more curved area on one side and a more blunt area on the other.

★ Try using flannel instead of

batting for mini-quilts, jackets, and other small projects.

★ Rinse well an empty plastic dish soap bottle and use it to fill your steam iron. It eliminates spills from cups and accumulation of dust on an open container of water. Just push the top down after using and it's always handy. Can also be taken to classes.

Again, no spills if the top is closed tightly.

Board Meeting Minutes

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING October 8, 2014

MEMBERS PRESENT: Cooky Amarel, Claire Poole, Cheryl Gaines, Wendy Cockrell, Linda Matsumoto, Margaret Brazelton, Cathy Evans, Delaina Watson, Carolyn McCray, Dee Jagerhorn, Carleen Hagen, Valerie Wilson, Nancy Wilson, Kim Buzolich, Sharon Easter, Diana Tatro, Jody Ohrt, and Ginger Benham.

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by incoming President Cooky Amarel at 12:00 p.m.

SECRETARY: A motion was made and seconded (Cockrell/Gaines) and unanimously voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the September 1, 2104 Board Meeting. A typo correction was noted to change “and” to “an” in the 8th sentence under “Committee Reports” from those minutes. A motion was made and seconded (Jagerhorn/N.Wilson) and unanimously voted to approve the minutes as corrected.

A letter was received from The National Quilt Museum in Paducah requesting the Guild donate quilts for their upcoming fundraiser. The VQG will not be participating as a group, but individuals may wish to donate on their own.

TREASURER: The checking accounting has a balance of \$11,198.05 and the savings account has a balance of \$16,060.17.

The current balance in the Fair Equity Account is \$675.20. We have not received a bill yet for the 2014 Fair Block Prize monies that the Guild pays for. The average from the last two years has been \$400, so there will be approximately \$275.20 in the account that the Guild can spend towards items to be used at the Fair.

Wendy requested that a large ice chest be purchased to use at the Christmas parties and at other Guild events. A motion was made and seconded (N.Wilson/Jagerhorn) and unanimously voted to approve the purchase of the ice chest. There are enough funds in the Property Budget to allow this purchase.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Questions have arisen regarding the cost of the room that is used for the monthly Board meetings. The room is used FREE as a courtesy for Guild business.

Wendy's husband is still doing research on the costs for portable microphones. She will have a report in November.

The room temperature for the monthly Guild meetings was discussed. The security guards working in the evenings have no control over the temperatures. This must be done by electronically by building staff that are working during the day. Carleen will make a call on the day of the meetings to remind them to check the evenings temperatures.

Carolyn requested help with setup/decorating for the Christmas Party, beginning at 10:00 a.m. on December 3. We just have one meeting left to purchase tickets for the party.

A Job Duties description is still being finalized for the Block of the Quarter. A motion was made and seconded (Cockrell/V.Wilson) and unanimously approved to add a line item for \$150 under Expenses to the Guild Budget for Block of the Quarter. A motion was made and seconded (Watson/V.Wilson) and unanimously approved to add a line item under Income to the Guild Budget for Block of the Quarter.

Ginger will be ordering the Red Shirts that will be used for the Quilt Show. Various sizes were discussed. This purchase was previously voted on and will be funded with the Property Budget.

Jody presented the certificate that will be given for those members qualifying for the 310 Club. She will be only accepting quilts for consideration at certain times for measurement and approval in the 310 Club and the Totally Me Club. A discussion was held on whether or not Kit Quilts should be considered in either of the clubs.

Toys for Tots – (unwrapped) – for kids in need at Beale Air Force Base

\$15 Gift Cards for Target, Walmart, and Starbucks – for the Yountville Veterans Home.

We will have a Board meeting in November but not in December because we do not have a November General Meeting.

The misuse of cell phones at the General Meeting was discussed at length. Several phones rang during our last meeting and two individuals spoke on their phones. A reminder will be given at the start of our meetings to turn your phones off or mute them. This will be enforced by the Sergeant at Arms during these meetings. It is very disruptive and rude to our speaker and other Guild members to have cell phones ring during our meetings.

The monthly meeting setup and take down of chairs and tables was discussed. It is every member's responsibility to help with this task if you are physically able to. Kim has received the Red Aprons that will be used at the Quilt Show for the Basket Raffle. She has modified the aprons with cell phone pockets and Kathy Mackay has embroidered VQG on them.

Dee reported that she has two openings left for Sew Day on October 18. It should be a fun day and will include lunch.

Wendy reported that there will be a Quilt Show Meeting tonight. She also reported that she is working on the 2016 Quilt Show. The Opportunity Quilt for 2016 will be presented at the March 2015 Wrap Up General Meeting.

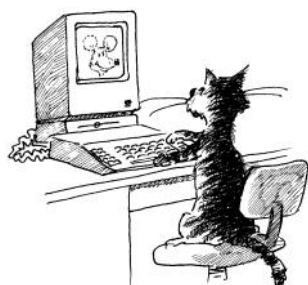
