Board Meeting Minutes

Valley Quilt Guild Board Meeting October 10, 2016 Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 4:05 pm by President Diane Steele.

Officers and Chairpersons present were Diane Steele, Diane Leighton, Janet Craver, Sharon Easter, Diana Tatro, Carolyn McCray, Millie Berryhill, Colleen Pelfrey, Cathy Evans, Wanda Horn, and Billie Lindgren. One guest, Helen Sousa, was present.

President's Comments: Diane Steele noted that she was pleased with the many members who volunteered at the last meeting. Members volunteered for Block of the Month and Community Service chairpersons. We also had 8 people or groups of people volunteer to decorate a table at the Christmas party, and 7 people or groups volunteer to put together a raffle basket for the Christmas party. The magazine table made \$3.00 **Minutes:** The secretary was absent. Billie Lindgren moved and Cathy Evans seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to approve the minutes. The motion was passed unanimously.

Correspondence: There were a few pieces of correspondence. Diane Leighton shared a thank you note, and Colleen mentioned that Linda Ballard had also sent a thank you note.

Treasurer's Report: Theresa Mihalyi was absent, but sent an email stating that our checking account balance was \$6,595.39 and our savings account balance was \$16,066.72.

Vice Presidents Upadates: Cathy Evans reported that the October speaker will be Jody Ohrt, and members will also have an opportunity to sign up for this year's challenge. Also on October 22 there will be Make a Difference Day from 9am to 4 pm. There are a lot of members signed up to participate. December 7 is the Christmas Party, the January meeting will be the All Things Quilt Show meeting, as well as a showcase by 3-5 of our own members. There will be sign ups for the quilt show, entries turned in for the quilt show, and voting on challenge quilts. On January 13 & 14 Linda Ballard will teach a class on her pattern "Hip to Be Square". In February, Colleen Pelfrey will share a trunk show with stories and will teach a class on "Taking out the Dye".

Colleen Pelfrey shared information concerning the Christmas party. After meeting with Diane Steele, the party is coming together nicely. Courthouse Café will be catering, and Diane Leighton will stay in contact with them. We could still use a few more volunteers to decorate tables (3:00 to 4:30 pm), donate raffle baskets, set up tables and hang community service quilts (10:00 am), help Gloria with the entry table, and clean up. We will have the Colusa quilt shop as a vendor, and entertainment was discussed. Cathy Evans and Billie Lindgren volunteered to sell raffle tickets. They need to check with Pat May if we have some, or if we need to buy some.

Unfinished Business: Unfinished business was combined with the report on the Christmas party concerning volunteers already noted in the last section.

New Business: Diane Steele shared that the Quilt Show Board would like for the Guild to join the Arts Council for \$50.00 and the Chamber of Commerce for \$200. After much discussion, Colleen Pelfrey

moved that we pay the \$250 to join both the Arts Council and the Chamber of Commerce. The motion was seconded by Millie Berryhill. The motion was unanimously approved.

Diane Steele also asked if we wanted to purchase a non-profit booth during the Christmas Stroll on Plumas Street for \$100. It would be an opportunity to sell Opportunity Quilt Tickets, to publicize our upcoming quilt show, and an outreach for anyone interested in joining the VQG. It was moved by Billie Lindgren to pay the \$100 for a non-profit booth at the Christmas Stroll, and seconded by Carolyn McCray. The motion was passed unanimously. Diane asked for specific guild information needed to fill out the application form.

There was discussion that the budget did not have a category which fit the cost for the Arts Council membership, the Chamber of Commerce membership, and the cost of a booth at the Christmas stroll. It was suggested that at our next meeting, Diane Steele include an agenda item to vote on adding a promotions category to our budget.

Partial mileage reimbursement for a guild member to attend NCQC and QGNQ meetings was discussed. The item was tabled until the next meeting. It was requested that at the next meeting, Diane include the following items on the agenda. 1) A \$35.00 reimbursement for a guild representative to attend the NCQC & QGNQ meetings, and share information via the newsletter 2) A new budget category for 1st and 2nd VP for the same partial mileage reimbursement for attending 2 NCQC meetings.

It was noted that the next board meeting would be at 4:00 on November 14, 2016 at Diane Leighton's house.

Members were reminded to have newsletter articles in to Kim Buzolich by October 20.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:37 by President Diane Steele


