AUCTION:

- A meeting of the **Valley Quilt Guild Board** was held on October 11, 2021, at Diane Leighton's home. It was called to order at 4:16 p.m.
- **Secretary:** A change was made to last month's minutes: The October 2nd workshop was cancelled. A motion to approve the minutes with the change was made by Eileen Milligan and seconded by Carleen Hagen. A unanimous vote to approve followed.
- **Treasurer:** We have a checking balance of \$2,211.16 and a savings balance of \$13,941.54; there is a Quilt Show balance of \$6,925.24 for a combined total of \$23,077.94.

Old Business: Meeting Venues: The October meeting will be held at Gray Avenue Church (1524 Gray Ave., Yuba City). There is no November general meeting. The Christmas party will be at the Moose Family Center on Thursday, December 2.

Internal Audit Update: Cooky Amarel has finished her part and passed it on to Nancy Wilson.

Christmas Party: Tickets will be on sale at the next general meeting for \$15. Sign ups for table decorations, doorprizes and raffle prizes will also be the meeting. Terry Nugent will invite Beale AFB to attend so that they may pick up the donated toys for their Hearts Apart Event. Colleen will talk to Stephen's Farmhouse about dessert for approximately 80 people. We are working on finding a vendor for the party. In addition, we will have an ugly/pretty Christmas sweater contest.

Auction: The auction will run from November 21-28 and will end early in the evening.
