Quilt Show Entries

Members...Time to start thinking about Quilt Show entries. This year's 2023 Quilt Show and theme is Red, White & Blue "Land That I Love". The show will be held on March 11th & 12th, 2023. This does not mean you cannot submit your other wonderful quilts you have been working on. We will have Rule of Entry and Quilt show Entry forms for both Regular (Non-Judged) and Judged Entries (these forms are printed in Red type) forms and instructions are available at our table starting with at the October General Meeting. So please stop by and pick up entry forms. We will also be accepting completed entry forms. Mailed entries can be sent or emailed to Pat May, PO Box 1166, Yuba City, CA 95992. We will **no longer** have our form available on our website. This did not work well for the 2022 Show and created too much additional paperwork.

IMPORTANT Reminders and Additional F.Y.I:

- · This year we will be having quilts hanging from above, similar to our Red & White Show several years ago. We will be calling this the **Upper Level** (<u>UL</u>). Please mark the upper Left hand corner of the Regular Entry form with a <u>UL</u> to be considered at layout for <u>UL</u> hanging:
- -the quilts must be Red/White & Blue
- -Size, fairly large (twin or bigger) they will not be returned on Sunday after the show as equipment and an empty room is needed for take down on Monday.
- · No Judged quilts will be hung on the <u>UL</u> and No final decision has been discussed for the turn in date for UL quilts.
- · All entries must have a completed Regular Entry form.
- · If your entry is to be Judged, you must have both a Regular Entry Form and a Judged Entry form, plus the \$5.00 entry fee.
- · Accurate Measurements please. Fabric Swatches & a good quality 4"X6" Photos need to be stapled of the top copy of the upper right corner of your Regular Entry form.
- · You must be a VQG Member to enter. (Please encourage anyone who wishes to enter to join the Guild).
- The entries per person are limited to 5.

IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER:

- · Last date to accept entries will be the January 25, 2023, at the VQG General Meeting.
- Entry numbers will be handed out on a 4" x 6" card at the VQG February General Meeting held on 2/22/23, along with your cloth labels. A entry # is assigned to your quilt/article, please put this number on your quilt/article label. You will need to save this card, as it is your receipt to pick up your quilt/article after the show.
- · Delivery of Judged Quilt Entries ONLY Quilts are to be delivered to the **LOCATION IS TO BE DETERMINED**, on Wednesday, March 8, 2023, between the hours of 8:30 and 9:30 a.m.
- · Delivery of your Regular quilt/article These must be delivered to the Y.S. Fairgrounds on Friday, March 10, 2023, starting at 8:00 a.m. and are to arrive no later than 9:30 a.m.
- · Delivery No final decision has been discussed for the turn in date of the UL quilts.
- · Pickup Quilt/article must be picked up on Sunday, March 12, 2023 from 5-5:30 p.m. Bring your card/receipt to claim your item(s). We are looking forward to a wonderful show this next year!!! Give us a call if you have any questions!

Board Meeting Minutes

VQG BOARD MEETING

Monday, October 10, 2022 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

- **I. Call to Order:** A Meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on October 10, 2022 at the Crossroads Community Church. It was called to order at 4:01 pm.
- II. Announcements and additions to the agenda: None
- **III. Secretary:** Cooky pointed out several corrections to the minutes. A motion to approve the minutes of the September meeting with corrections was made by Colleen Pelfrey and seconded by Cooky Amarel. <u>A unanimous vote to approve followed.</u>
- **IV. Treasurer:** We have a Checking balance of \$2,921.61 and a Savings balance of \$15,956.49. The Quilt Show balance is \$5,013.66 making our combined total \$23,891.76. A motion to accept the budget report was made by Nicki Lura and seconded by Diane Leighton. A unanimous vote to approve followed.

V. Old Business

Demonstration of Pipe and Drape System – Colleen demonstrated how the lanyard and hook system worked. The group discussed the options available for making the lanyard system instead of purchasing a premade system which is quite expensive. Colleen is confident that all the parts can be found and/or custom made for us. DeRay Jensen demonstrated the drape system which included discussion of different pipe configurations and the quality of the black 8'x4' drapes. DeRay will contact the pipe and drape company to get a quote on how many pipes and drapes we can purchase within our budget.

The whole system requires no ladders to assemble and much less space for storage.

DeRay also commented that we are the largest quilt show in Northern California and should start to look like it.

The Board has already approved \$7,500 for purchase of a new system. The majority of this money will go toward the pipes and drapes with the rest being spent on the parts to assemble the lanyard system. It was the consensus of the board to move forward with the purchase. Colleen and DeRay will get together to finalize the order once they get a quote from the company.

New Email Address for the Board – Cathy Klaker reported that the guild has an active account with GoDaddy, the owners of the guild domain name, paid through 2024. She is still waiting for them to approve the application for access to the account since no current member has the access information.

Storage Units – Jan Thompson expressed concern for the lack of continuity in the billing system. Colleen will gain access to the unit in order to install the dust strip to the bottom of the door.

Minutes continued...

Christmas Party – Colleen reported that 44 tickets have been sold and she has sign-ups for 5 door prizes, 8 large raffle baskets, and 5 tables to be decorated. We need 10 more sign-ups for table to be decorated. Linda Matsumoto volunteered to sell raffle tickets and Evon Smith may need an extra person to help her with hospitality. Ham and chicken will be served this year and she will contact Stephens Farm House for desserts.

Auction – Colleen has 11 items for the auction. The Board gave Colleen permission to send out a group email to ask for more items.

VI. New Business:

Fidget Quilts – Carol Ramirez from Rideout Hospital has requested more fidget quilts. The Board okayed Colleen spearheading the fidget quilt project, through our group Facebook page, email and possible a zoom sew day. Diane Leighton also reported that Rideout is implementing a hospice unit and that once she has more information, we may reconsider sending quilts to the hospital. Diane is also going to contact Yuba College about the possibility of making fleece quilts for the childcare center since fleece quilts could be washed every week.

VII. Committee Reports:

A. Vice Presidents: Deanna reported that Lina Schmidt will be this month's speaker. There will be a sew day on October 22 at the Fremont conference center. Colleen reported that Sandra Torres would like to send out a survey to the members asking for what they would like to have as classes. The board's consensus was that Sandra would send out a survey using Google forms via the newsletter link.

- **B. Community Service –** See above Fidget Quilts
- **C. Membership**: Nicki Lura reported that we have 150 paid members and 10 affiliates. She will publish the roster.
- **D.** Quilt Show 2023: This year's pins, postcards and tickets have been ordered. Postcards have been received and some distributed. Vendors are on track. Entry forms are available and will be accepted until January. If a photo is included with the entry form it should be 4" x 6" only.
- **E. Opportunity Quilt 2023:** Dee will be displaying the Opportunity Quilt in the bank the month of December. She received a request from Elk Grove Quilt Guild to come to our meetings. We may be able to visit them in return. It was suggested that Dee consider VFWs, Rotary, American Legion and to contact Sandy Watson in Pat May's office to visit Gridley VFW.

F. Other: None

Adjournment: A motion was made by Colleen and seconded by Cooky to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 5:16 pm.
