Thanks for all that helped with the Ice Cream Social, it was a great success. And yes we are planning


for our Christmas Party already. I guess you just have to keep up with time. :)

VALLEY QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING September 10, 2018

Call to order: A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held at Crossroads Community Church, 445 B Street in Yuba City on September 10, 2018. It was called to order by President Janell Willis 4:03 pm.

President remarks: Welcome everyone.

Secretary: A motion was made (Janet/Billie) to accept the minutes as reported. Unanimous approval followed.

Treasurer: Checking balance as of September 10, 2018 is \$7,912.49. Savings balance as of September 10, 2018 is \$19,073.36.

Unfinished Business:

Ice Cream Social - Wrap-up: Everything went as planned. Regular and lactose-free ice cream was provided and enjoyed. Entertainment was provided by Colleen Pelfrey and Tammy Morrison with an accompaniment provided by the members of the guild.

Let It Go Wrap-Up: The event was a huge success with lots of fabrics, books, patterns, magazines, and other assorted quilting items available to anyone who could lay their hands on them first. There were a number of items left over. The fabric went first to the Dress-a-Girl program at the Bayside Church in Granite Bay. They gave us a shout-out on their Facebook page and in their newsletter. The fabric donation was greatly appreciated. Then Janell took the fabric up to the Camptonville School. What they did not want went to the Samaritan Village Thrift Shop in Yuba City. The leftover books were taken by Melanee Vieira to be donated to Kenya. The remaining items left over were taken to the Sutter Buttes Canine Rescue Thrift Shop on Gray Avenue.

Audit Updates: Audit of the guild accounts have been completed by Sharon and passed on to Diane Leighton. Audit of the show accounts are still underway and will be passed on to Diane when completed.

Christmas Party Updates: Court House Café has been contacted and we have a verbal agreement for the dinner. We will keep the price the same as last year. Theme for the party will be "Oh, What Fun!" and tickets will be available at the September and October meetings. Billie will be in charge of ticket sales, also signups for the table decorations.

<u>New Business</u>

Quilt Show Budget: Quilt show chair Colleen Pelfrey met with the new show treasurer Nikki Snyder to prepare a budget, which was then presented to the Board. Motion was made (Diane L/Joetta) and approved. Treasurer:

Purchase of Lattice for Quilt Show: The existing lattice is quite old and is warped and split, and several sheets were discarded. It was proposed that the guild buy 10 sheets of lattice at a cost of approximately \$350. It was also suggested that a wooden frame might be attached to make a frame around each sheet of lattice to provide more stability and make it last longer. A motion was made (Janet/Billie) to approve this expenditure. Motion carried.

Quilt Show Report: Post cards have been printed with both opportunity quilts on them.

Opportunity Quilt Policies: It was suggested that VQG adopt a policy regarding booking other guilds bringing their quilt to our meetings. We are currently booked all the way through 2021 and part way into 2022. It was decided to announce we would not accept any more bookings at this time. We will have a list of open dates made available on our website. Diane Leighton will look into showing our quilt at PIQF. It would be a good venue, but we will have to have 2-3 or more members at the show every day. Diane said she would look into reserving hotel rooms for the duration of the show.

Opportunity Quilt: The opportunity quilt will be displayed at Sperbeck's Customer Appreciation Day October 6. We will need people to work at our table to sell tickets. See Billie to sign up for a shift.

Committee Reports

Vice President Updates: Colleen reported the only new item on the agenda is Dora Cary with a program on February 27 and a workshop on Thursday following the meeting. She is from Paso Robles.

Community Service: Diane reported we gave 10 quilts to the Cancer Center in September. Our goal is up to 10 quilts every month.

Membership: Joetta reported that we currently have 156 members, including affiliates, lifetime members, and junior members.

UFO: Participation is very slow going.

Block of the Month: Eileen reported she is having a slight problem with the EQ program, and as a result the BOM project will not start until the January meeting.

Next Board Meeting is at Crossroads church on October 8, 2018. Meeting begins at 4:00 pm. Adjournment: Meeting was adjourned at -- 5:19 pm.

Helpful Hints from Alyce

Difficulty threading a needle? Dampen the eye (spit works!) instead of the thread. It glides through more easily.

Shine a light behind the needle so the opening is more visible. Or hold up a light piece of paper for more visibility.

Y Cut the thread at an angle and yes, it can be cut on a slant.


Having difficulty telling the right side from the wrong side of a piece of fabric? Look at the selvedge edge on both sides. One will be slightly rougher and have a slight change in color.




