In Memoriam Alyce Kauffman, a charter member of Valley Quilt Guild and a friend to many of us, passed away earlier this month. Alyce has always had a hand in the guild, from helping to start the guild in the early 80s, to chairing the quilt show and piecing the opportunity quilt in 1994, to being one of the featured quilters in the 2013 show, to most recently making sure that you always had "Helpful Hints from Alyce" in the newsletter and a chance to win some "Fat Chance Fat Quarters" at guild meetings. I think she worried about those last two even as she was in the hospital. She took her jobs seriously. I became better friends with Alyce just a few years ago, when she found out I was interested in dyeing fabric. She invited me to her house and spent a day sharing what she knew and helping me to dye some fabric. She was 30 years older than me, and literally wore me out. I have a quilt made with the fabric I dyed called "Alyce, I'm Tired". One of the last visits I had with Alyce, she told me when she was feeling better, she wanted a ride on my motorcycle. That didn't really surprise me. I don't know what Alyce was made of, but it was pretty tough stuff. Also pretty loving stuff. One of the last things she did was ask that her quilting supplies be given to her quilting friends. Alyce was loved, and will be greatly missed.





VALLEY QUILT GUILD 2021 QUILT CHALLENGE

- 8. Once you accept the challenge, call Dee (530-701-5410) and she will issue you an entry number, label, and entry form.

A meeting of the **Valley Quilt Guild Board** was held on August 10, 2020. It was an online meeting using the ZOOM application since the pandemic quarantine is still in effect. It was called to order at 4:01 p.m. A special announcement was made informing the Board Members that longtime member, Alyce Kauffman had passed away. Colleen also took a moment to tell us that Cindy Needham will be collecting usable sewing machines, quilting tools and quilts to give to the fire survivors.

Secretary: A motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting was made by Cooky Amarel and seconded by Diane Leighton. The motion was passed with one abstention.

Treasurer: VQG Treasurer Janet Craver reported that we have a checking balance of \$2,076.66 and a savings balance of \$15,138.21.

Modified "Let It Go" There was not a huge response to this so we are going to just facilitate what comes through but won't actively pursue new donations.

Christmas Party: We will cancel our reservation of Whiteaker Hall by October if we are not out of quarantine by then. Colleen is considering adding a November Zoom Meeting just for fun with the program being a photo tour of last year's Houston Quilt Festival and Market. We discussed having the Christmas Party like the Ice Cream Social with maybe an ugly Christmas Mask contest and a slide show of everyone's trees.

Rally Up Online Auction We will auction items that Colleen receives by mid-October. Diane Leighton mentioned that since the Sutter Quilt Auction was cancelled this year that perhaps their people would be interested in viewing our auction.

Internal Audit Cooky is done with her portion, but Nancy Wilson is still working on her portion.

Billie Lindgren took this time to mention that we needed to do an audit of the government forms that the Treasurer fills out. After much discussion it was decided that Billie and Janet would get a list of the government forms to Colleen and Colleen would coordinate with Cooky to put together a checklist so that these forms are handled in a consistent manner when the Board changes Treasurers.

Online Zoom Class with Jane Haworth Not enough members signed up for this, so it was cancelled.

Saturday Zoom Sew Day The Sew Day will be on September 19, 2020 and 20 people have signed up.

Virtual Quilt Show Colleen is almost done with the photos for this and will be posting it online.

New Business: Quilt Show entry forms. We will put off gathering the application forms for the 2021 Quilt Show until January. By then we hope to have a clearer idea if the show will be able to take place.

Red Binders Vouchers Janet reported that 1,000 vouchers will cost approximately \$236. Cooky Amarel made a motion that we provide \$250 for the vouchers and it was seconded by Carleen Hagen. A unanimous vote followed.

Website Domain Renewal Janet sent a copy of the bill, dated July 31, 2020 to Terry Nugent for her records. Terry confirmed with our webpage designers that this is a yearly fee and they send us the bill.

Switching Banks There was a discussion to switch to River Valley Bank. We have been having various problems with fees and accessing the online accounts with our old bank. Billie Lindgren made a motion that we move all our accounts to River Valley Bank and Cooky Amarel seconded. A unanimous vote followed. Janet and Cooky will begin the process of moving over. Duplicate checks for both the Guild Treasurer and the Quilt Show Treasurer will be used moving forward. Pat Smith was instructed to order new duplicate checks (starting at the number 1,000) once we are at River Valley Bank and Cooky stressed the importance of using the checks in numerical order. Both Janet and Colleen stated that they need access to the Quilt Show accounts as well as the Guild accounts.

Budget revisited. Janet asked Community Service if they could start finding pro bono longarmers for our community quilts. We also decided that we needed to start looking for more economical speakers. We will try to make a go of those classes we have already scheduled, but we will not be scheduling any new classes in the foreseeable future.

.Government Reports Janet feels we need to have the government reports done by a knowledgeable party or a professional. Colleen is going to send a letter out to the guild members to see if anyone can help with this area. It was discussed that we need one person who can become an expert with these forms and who can help the incumbent Treasurer every year.

Lifetime Member Nomination Sharon Easter moved to nominate Shirley Taylor for Lifetime Membership. Eileen Milligan seconded, and the motion was carried.

Bublup Colleen is working on a new free website that we can load our forms on. Viewing the site is by invitation only.

Day and time for Board Meetings/General Meetings The General Meetings will still be held by Zoom on the last Wednesday of the month as per usual. The time for the next Board meeting was changed to the second Tuesday in October at 11:00 a.m.

Vice President's Updates: Jane Haworth is scheduled for September 30th but her class has been cancelled.

Tracy Brookshire's lecture is scheduled for October 28 but the workshop has been cancelled.

Sandy Corbin is scheduled for February 24, 2021.

Community Service: Diane Leighton said we received 18 tops from Rosie Stearns from Sunsweet and 20 from Dee Jagerhorn. Janet Craver moved that we preapprove giving quilts from Community Service to Cindy Needham to give to fire survivors should we not get many from individual members. Diane Leighton seconded, and a unanimous vote followed.

Opportunity Quilt The quilt will be on display at Friends Around the Block in Colusa from Tuesday (9/22/20) until Saturday (9/26/20). Then the quilt will be shown at Sew Katie Jean in Lincoln from October 20 – 24th.

Membership: There are 129 members, 6 affiliates, 7 juniors and 5 lifetime members.

UFO There will be information on the Linda Ballard challenge in the Newsletter and we may come up with a raffle prize.

Adjournment The meeting was adjourned at 6:09 p.m.
